

Farms and Farmsteads

Other Farms and Farmsteads mentioned in papers and other documents.

1851 Census - Sarah KIRBY, widow, 24 acres and 4 labourers.

1855 – For Sale – Freehold close of Pasture Land known as 'Harnell Meadow', 6 acres, in occupation of a Mr. BUCKLAND. *Reading Mercury 3-11-1855*.

1858 – Robert THATCHER fined 12s including costs and ordered to return to his master, John COLLET's, farm. Swindon Advertiser 11-04-1858

1860 'Bradburn's', small farm farmhouse, cow house, barn, sheds and 55 acres, 35 arable rest to pasture, in occupation of Thomas GREENAWAY. Subject to annual payment of £10 8s to Christ's Hospital, Abingdon Five enclosures in Upper Stratton, 48 acres. 'Seven Halves & Flaxlands', 'The Great Marsh', 'Little Marsh', 'Flaxlands', and 'Brake'. In occupation of John TANNER. Quit rent to Lord of Manor, Corsham £1 3s 3d. Land called 'Crowdy's Hill', 15 acres on west side of Cirencester Road. Land Tax 14s.

'The Butts & Plimney', 7 ½ acres with house, barns in occupation of Thomas CRIPPS and cottage in occupation of Edmund Ford. (fields of Cloche Farm.)

Arable land called 'Mead' or 'Madcroft', 7½ acres in possession of John TANNER (*now around Gay*'s *Place*) 'The Little Lay', acre of pasture land. (*off Green Road*).

- Pasture land, 'The Way Ground', 'The Marsh or York's Ground' next to GWR in occupation of John TANNER. Annual Corn Rent 2s 10½d. (now Copse Avenue.)

All for sale as part of Tuckey Estate. Swindon Advertiser 09-07-1860.

1877 Henry WITHERS, farmer, took his shepherd to court for not attending some ill sheep. *The Western Daily Press 1-9-1877.*

1878 – J. SARGENT, Stratton advertising for Married man as a milker and general hand. *Swindon Advertiser 23-03-1878*.

1890 – John WEBB, errand-bay, and John PULLEN, schoolboy, were each fined 1s and 8s 9d costs, for stealing apples from the orchard of Mr. T. TYSON, farmer, of Stratton. *Citizen 26-9-1890*

1893 – DEATH - MANNERS, May 9 at Nythe Farm, Stratton, Henry Allen son of D L Manners, aged 4 months. Swindon Advertiser 27-05-1893.

1894 – William GREENWAY, farmer of Stratton, for selling milk to which 10 per cent water and 8 percent boric acid had been added. Fined 17s 6d and £3 2s 6d costs. *Citizen 2-2-1894*.

- 1901 Frank RUSSELL, farmer of Stratton, fined £1 including costs for driving a bull, exceeding 18 months, without being properly secured. *Citizen 31-5-1901*

 - Inquest on William GODWIN, farmer, Pump Lane. Swindon Advertiser 13-09-1901.
