Your Council, Working for You

Annual Report 2008/2009. As another financial year draws to a close, it is a good opportunity to reflect on some of the achievements that the Parish Council has accomplished over the past year, as well as the changes and progress made.

The year commenced without a Deputy Clerk following the departure of Mrs Caroline Buckland to pursue a career in the private sector. She served the Parish Council well over the past few years, especially with her input into Stratton Community Leisure Centre and she is missed.

Annual programmes were implemented with continued work being carried out to the footpaths in Merton Fields, upgrading of the play equipment at Meadowcroft, additional dog bins being placed throughout the Parish, the provision of new fencing at the Lower Stratton Cemetery, continued support for the Community Bus and various other local voluntary organisations and the ongoing high quality care and

maintenance of all areas under the management of the Parish Council.

The Parish Council leases a number of pieces of land from Swindon Borough Council. One of these areas was the open section of Merton Fields. However, due to proposals being developed for the former Headlands School site, this lease reverted back to the Borough Council on 11th November 2008.

Sadly in March 2009 the existing Clerk, Bob Blake, who has been with the Council for over ten years and has been Clerk for eight of those, will be retiring. Bob took over as Clerk on 1st June 2001 and has overseen Stratton St Margaret Parish Council become a Best Value Council, implemented the repair and replacement programme for all

equipment and vehicles to spread the cost, ensured that the Council is run leanly and efficiently, was responsible for the provision of the first roundabouts for disabled children in Swindon, was instrumental in providing the multi-use games areas at Meadowcroft and Grange Drive, purchased the new Community Minibus and will be leaving behind him a ship that is in very good order.

A new Deputy Clerk, Paul Russell, was appointed and took up his position in late May 2008. On 1st April 2009 Paul will be taking over as Parish Clerk and his replacement will be Mrs Elizabeth Hawkes, currently Parish Clerk to Great Glen Parish Council in Leicestershire. Elizabeth will be moving to the area with her family in due course and will be taking up her position on 1st June 2009

Update - Headlands School/Merton Fields

As many residents will know, Swindon Borough Council is developing proposals to redevelop this site

As many residents will know, Swindon Borough Council is developing proposals to redevelop this site. Following initial plans which were featured in the previous issue of Stratton Parish News, further work has been carried out by the Borough. One of the main issues to come out of the public consultation was a concern regarding potential flooding of the site if it is developed. The Borough Council

believes that it has found a solution to the problem and has obtained Environment Agency approval. It is expected that, in the long term, the site will be used for residential development but in the short term it is hoped that the majority of the site could be utilised for sports and recreation usage provided that some of the issues regarding the existing school building can be overcome.

With regard to Merton Fields, the proposal to construct a new access from Cricklade Road was a non-starter. No construction is expected on the fields except for the provision of two junior and two mini football pitches to counteract the loss of facilities at the former school site.

As further information becomes available we shall update you.



The Parish Precept

Each year Stratton St Margaret Parish Council has to set a budget for the forthcoming financial year.

The budget for 2009/2010 was considered at the full Council meeting held on Tuesday 27th January 2009 when it was agreed to set a precept of £861,000, equivalent to £110.08 per Band D property, an increase of 2.5% on 2008/2009.


The Council has a number of projects planned for 2009/2010 including its continued investment programme into the play areas, the annual tree maintenance programme, a Master Planning study of play provision within the Parish, an architectural feasibility study for Stratton Community Leisure Centre, the development of a "Stratton Parish Plan", the quarterly publication of "Stratton Parish News" and an application to become a Quality Council.

In addition it is working with Swindon Borough Council to identify areas where cost savings can be made and a number of options have already been identified. Table (a) indicates where the money will be spent in the forthcoming year. Graphs (b) and (c) show income and expenditure respectively



Focus On...The Planning Committee

The Planning Committee meets, on average, twice monthly to review planning applications relating to land in Stratton St Margaret and submitted to the Planning Authority, Swindon Borough Council.

Stratton St Margaret Parish Council is a statutory consultee and as such has no planning powers, but its views must be taken into consideration by the Planning Authority.

Most applications are normally for low impact developments such as

extensions and conservatories but larger developments, proposals for new dwellings and advertising are also received on a regular basis. The Committee considers the impact of each application on the local environment and tries to provide a local perspective

when responding. It is chaired by Cllr Mrs Carol Day and the Vice Chair is Cllr Mrs Teresa Page. Every meeting is open to the public and there is an opportunity to address the committee if you wish to raise any planning or highway matters.
