The Reign of George V. May 6 th. 1935, saw people all over England celebrating the Silver Jubiles of Thing George X and our gracious Riem Mary The Sting's reign has been a very interest ing one and many important wants have happened Until 1911, when the national Insurance act was passed no provision was made for people who were all of unable to work, but the act enabled them to pay units a Society and so receive trenefit when ill, of whemployed. In 1911, too, an act was passed thinking the forver of the House of Commons, The Ting and Rusen made a lour of India in the same year. In 1912 Baptain Scott, with Sir Emest Shacklelon made an engladition to the South Pole, Scott died from eseposure and the privations. This year aboo saw the sinking of the ditance a wessel thought to be unsinhable. This was a terrible thing and many tives were lost. From 1914 to 1914 we were taking part in the great war. During that time the Hing visited his troops several times in I tance, encourt aging them. The great war saused wontold movery to all countries concerned, at the end of the wat the deague of nations was formed, and by it many wats have been averted. In 1917 the Daylight Saving act was passed, which gives children longer evening hours for play. an Imperial tenforence was also held this year,

and there have been several since, and through these the British Empire has become more closely bound ligether than over.
