This is the last Will and Testament of me Thomas Mulcock of Penhill in the parish of Stratton St. Margaret in the county of Wilts, labourer, being of sound and disposing minds memory and understanding. I Give and Bequeath at and immediately after my death unto my beloved wife, Mary Mulcock, the sum of forty pounds also all the household goods, bed, bedding and furniture thereunto belonging, that is to say all the goods and chattels that belonged to her my said wife previous to the day of our marriage. Also, I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Ballard or her afsigns my other bed, bedstead, bedding and furniture thereunto belonging. All the rest, residue and remainder of my property and estate, being all personal, I give to my five children David and Peter Mulcock, and my daughters Mary Pearce, Dinah Fords and Sarah Ballard or their afsigns equally to be divided between and among them share and share alike and equally to be divided between and among the lawful issue of such of my said children as shall then be then dead such issue to take his, her or their deceased parent or parents share. And I do hereby appoint my sons David and Peter Mulcock my executors of this my Will and declare that my executors shall not be answerable one for another nor for more money than they shall respectively and actually receive and by no means for involuntary losses, and I hereby revoke all former Wills in witness hereof. I the said Thomas Mulcock have to this Last Will and Testament let and subscribed my hand and seal this thirteenth day of February One Thousand eight hundred and forty-three.
