## Job Payne

Job Payne was born around 1840 at Sutton Mandeville, Wiltshire, England to parents Ryall Pegham & Amelia Payne. He was baptized at Sutton Mandeville on 7<sup>th</sup> June, 1840 with only his mother listed – Amelia Payne.

The 1841 England Census recorded Job Payne as 1 year old living at Long's, Sutton Mandeville. Also included in the household were – Stephen <u>Pain</u> (aged 60), Mary <u>Pain</u> (aged 60), Ruben <u>Pain</u> (aged 30), Mary <u>Pain</u> (aged 25), Amelia <u>Pain</u> (aged 20), Stephen <u>Pain</u> (aged 2), Job <u>Pain</u> (aged 1) & Jane <u>Pain</u> (aged 3 months). (Noteaults' ages were rounded up or down to the nearest 5 years in the 1841 Census).

Amelia Payne – Job's mother, married Charles Batten (father's name Benjamin Batten) on 26<sup>th</sup> October, 1848 at Everleigh, Devizes, Wiltshire. (Charles Batten was born at Hungerford, Berkshire – possibly 31<sup>st</sup> May, 1811).

The 1851 England Census recorded Job Payne as "Job (Pain) Batten" an 11 year old (born Sutton Mandeville) living with his mother, stepfather & half-brother at Everleigh, Wiltshire. Details of those listed were - Charles Batten (Agricultural Labourer, aged 40, born Berkshire) Amelia Batten (aged 38, born Sutton Mandeville), Edwin Batten (aged 2, born Everleigh).

Charles & Amelia Batten embarked for Australia with their children – Edwin & Job (Job was Charles' stepson) in 1854. They arrived in New South Wales, Australia on 7<sup>th</sup> September, 1854 having arrived aboard the vessel *Tantivy*. Details given were – Charles Batten – aged 42, Farm Labourer, born Hungerford Berkshire, parents – Benjamin & Hannah Batten (residing at Newton, Hampshire). Amelia Batten – aged 36, born Sutton Mandeville, parents Stephen & Mary Payne (residing in Sutton Mandeville). Job (Payne) Batten – aged 14, Farm Labourer, born Sutton Mandeville, parents – Ryall Pegham – dead & Amelia – on Board. Edwin Batten – aged 5, born Everleigh, Wiltshire, parents – on board.

A birth was registered in the district of Goulburn, New South Wales in 1864 for Amelia Batten, the daughter of Charles & Amelia Batten (nee Payne). (Her birth may have been 29<sup>th</sup> December, 1863 at Longreach, Goulburn, NSW).

Jobe Payne married Elizabeth Jane Bunter on 18<sup>th</sup> April, 1867 at Church of England, High Range, near Berrima, NSW. They had the following children:

- Anne B. Payne born 1870
- Stephen B. Payne born 1872
- Selina Payne born 1874
- William John Payne born 1875

- Amelia Payne born 1881

A death was registered in Goulburn, NSW in 1878 for Charles Batten (father's name Benjamin Batten). Charles Batten died at the age of 66 years at Longreach, Goulburn, NSW on 12<sup>th</sup> April, 1878.

Amelia Batten married George Meadley in Goulburn, New South Wales, Australia in 1880. They had married on 31<sup>st</sup> January, 1880.

Job Payne married Agnes Hackney (widow) on 7<sup>th</sup> June, 1887 at Mittagong, NSW.

A Warrant was published in NWS Police Gazettes on 1<sup>st</sup> February, 1888 at Mittagong, NSW for the desertion of Job Payne:

Mittagong- A warrant has been issued by the Mittagong Bench for the arrestof Job Payne, charged with unlawfully deserting his wife, Agnes Payne, at Mittagong, on the 12<sup>th</sup> October last, leaving her without means of support. He is about 50 years of age, 5 feet 1 inch high, medium build, dark complexion, dark hair, whiskers, and moustache turning gray; a labourer. Supposed to have gone to Taralga.

A death was registered in Goulburn, NSW in 1897 for Amelia Medley (parents Stephen and Mary). Amelia Meadley (nee Payne, formerly Batten) died at the age of 79 on 13<sup>th</sup> February, 1897.

An article in the Robertson Advocate, NSW on Friday 12th December, 1902 reads:

Among the old age pensions granted by the Goulburn Board on Friday last were the following:- Job Payne, labourer, Mittagong, 65, £26;......

An article in the Wagga Wagga Express, NSW on Thursday 24th January, 1907 reads:

On Tuesday morning, at the Wagga Police Court, MessrsJ. Jeremy, J.P. and W. Purtell, J.P. continued the hearing of the charge against an old man named Job Payne for maliciously setting fire to natural grass at Tootool, on January 11<sup>th</sup>. Less than half an acre of grass land was burnt. The Bench with little hesitation granted Payne an acquittal.

Job Payne died on 5<sup>th</sup> December, 1916 at Liverpool Asylum, Sydney, NSW. A death for Job Payne, aged 77 years, was registered in 1916, in the district of Liverpool, Sydney, NSW. Cause of death from death certificate chronic myocarditis, senile dementia, in hospital since 21 November 1916. Other details listed included – number of years in Australia – 16; born – Wiltshire; Marriage & children – unknown.

Job Payne was buried on 7<sup>th</sup> December, 1916 at Church of England Cemetery, Liverpool, NSW.
