The architects are Messrs Petter & Warren, of Yeovil, and the new hotel will provide every accommodation, tea gardens, garages, and an excellent pull-in in beautiful surroundings facing the Downs, which have been made a landmark by the regimental crests cut out on them by troops stationed in the area during the war.
