William Wyndham, esq.

The Will of William Wyndham, esq., of Dinton, Wilts, was proved in London, on the 24th ult. under £14,000 personalty, the executors therein appointed being his wife, Ellen Wyndham; his eldest son, William Wyndham, esq., and his brother in law, Eustace Heathcote, esq. The Will bears date March, 1854, and is of moderate dimensions; the dispositions are entirely confined to the members of his family. He has devised his freehold estates at Dinton and Sutton Mandeville, together with his manors and farms of Norrington and Tree, in the county of Wilts, to his eldest son, subject to certain charges under settlement in favour of younger children, which, with appointments and bequests that will fall in on the demise of his relict, will realise to each of them a sum of £5000. The remainder of his property he leaves to his elder son, whom he appoints residuary legatee. The testator, who attained to the age of sixty six, was a magistrate and Deputy Lieutenant for Wilts, and late Major of the Wilts Yeomanry, and was formerly M.P. for South Wilts.
