Miss A. M. Partridge wrote to The Register from Warminster, Wiltshire, England, on April 26:- "I have just been, with friends, to Sutton Veny, to see the graves of the Australians who died at that hospital, or in the neighbourhood. As a constant visitor at the hospital I mad many friends; and it was always with poignant sorrow one heard that, after coming safely through the war, a patient had succumbed to illness. To-day we made a pilgrimage to the graves to see if they had been remembered on Anzac Day, and we found that each Australian grave in the beautiful little churchyard had a bunch of flowers on it. Your readers who may have known some of these who are buried at Sutton Veny may like to know that their dear ones have been remembered.
