

Post Office Directory Extract 1855 Sutton Veny



Sutton Veny is a township, village, and parish, close to Tytherington, in the Hundred and Union of Warminster, South Wilts, 3 miles south-east-by-south from Warminster station, 117 from London, and 2 south-west from Heytesbury.

The living is a rectory, value £800, in the archdeaconry and diocese of Salisbury, and the gift of G. W. Heneage, Esq; the Rev. G. F. S. Powell, M.A., is the present incumbent. The church of St. Leonard is an ancient structure, and consists of nave, aisles and chancel; the tower contains 6 bells.

Here is a place of worship for Independents, and a small Free school.

Population, in 1851, 860. Area in acres, 3494; rateable value, £3,665.

NEWHAM is half a mile north-west; Hopping, quarter of a mile south, Redding Hanging, 3 miles south.

Free School, Mrs Elizabeth Long, mistress
