

VILLAGE REMEMBERED ANZACS

Anzac Day observances round the world yesterday ranged from solemn ceremonies in major capitals to a simple but moving scene in a tiny Wiltshire, England, village churchyard, where 70 World War I Anzacs and two Australian nurses are buried.

The village, Sutton Veny, was headquarters of the Anzac forces during World War I.
