

Marriage of Miss Emma Everett to the Rev. Henry Ravenhill

Marriage Festivities

On Tuesday last, there was a universal exhibition of kindly feeling amongst all classes at Sutton Veney, called forth by the marriage of Miss Emma Everett, daughter of the late Mr. Everett, of Greeenhill, with the Rev. Henry Ravenhill, of Buckland Newton, a younger son of Mr. Ravenhill, of Ashton House. The high and well-deserved esteem in which both families are regarded in the neighbourhood and throughout the county, invested the occasion with an unusual interest, whilst the hearty sympathies of the people bore testimony to the value in which Miss Everett was held by those who surrounded her old home.

Triumphal arches, wreaths, and festoons were liberally displayed throughout the village, and the church was very tastefully decorated. The choir (in whose formation and support the bride had taken so lively and efficient an interest) welcomed her entrance with a bridal hymn. The ceremony was performed by the Dean of Wells. The organ pealed forth the "Wedding March," and the bells rang merry peals. The girls in her Sunday class strewed flowers in the path of the bride, and the utmost possible respect and attachment was shown from all parties towards the happy couple.
