

Crimean Veteran's Death

Thomas Emery, lately residing at 66 Gooch Street, Swindon, who served in the Crimean War, has just passed away at the age of 70. Deceased was employed up to and within two months ago in the Fitting Shop of the Waggon Department of the G.W.R. Works and enjoyed the best of health. The cause of death was heart failure.

Mr. Emery served from the beginning to the end of the Crimean War in the 21st Fusiliers, and was awarded three medals and four clasps for the battles of Balaclava, Inkerman, Sebastopol and Alma. He was also the possessor of the Turkish long service and good conduct medals. At the conclusion of the Crimean War deceased was transferred to the 2nd 16th Foot, with which he served in the Barbados and West Indies. The funeral will take place on Saturday, leaving the house at 4.15, and friends are asked to accept this intimation.
