## Lieutenant A. R. Mutter of Swindon

Official intimation has been received that Lieutenant A. R. Mutter, Wilts Regiment, of Swindon, is a prisoner of war. Educated at Clifton College he held a commission in the Territorial Force at the outbreak of the war. He has been a regular playing member of Swindon Cricket Club and has a good reputation as a batsman.

He is the son of Mrs. and the late Captain A. R. Mutter. His father, who was for several years musical director of Swindon Amateur Musical and Dramatic Society, died in the Service recently, from illness.

## **OPC Notes:-**

A. R. Mutter, Jnr. is Anthony Robert Mutter, born about 1918 in Dorset. A marriage recorded in the Ealing District in 1948 could possibly suggest that Anthony survived the war, and if this is the same Anthony R. Mutter he married Margarete A. Reckshausen. At the time of transcription no death has been found for Anthony Robert Mutter. Anthony was held in Camp O7B located at Eichstatt in Bavaria, Germany. His POW number was 3572.

A. R. Mutter, Snr. is Abraham Robert Mutter, born in Dorset about 1884, Abraham died of illness on home service on 31st January 1941. He is commemorated on the Brookwood 1939-1945 Memorial. No burial place has been found at the time of this transcription.
