

An Objection Upheld

Harold Evans, of 4, Weaveland Road, Tisbury, was summoned for driving a motorcoach without due care and attention.

He was defended by Mr. A. B. Lemon, and pleaded not guilty.

Mr. Lemon raised an objection that the information was bad. He said that the notice of prosecution had to be give either at the time of the offence or in writing within 14 days where no notice of prosecution had been given. The alleged offence was in August, and the summons was dated September 28th.

The bench upheld Mr. Lemon's contention, and the case was dismissed.
