

Post Office Directory Extract 1855 West Dean



WEST DEAN, a township, parish, village, and railway station, on the Salisbury railway and canal, in Alderbury Hundred, Stockbridge Union, South Wilts, and partly in Hampshire, 88 miles from London, 7 east from Salisbury and 7½ north-west from Romsey; the living is a rectory, in the archdeaconry and diocese of Salisbury, and in the patronage and incumbency of the Rev. Francis Glossop, M.A. The church, which is a small structure, is dedicated to the Virgin Mary. In the chancel are several monuments to the Evelyn family. Here is a small Parochial school for boys and girls. The population, in 1851, was West Dean, 308 (183 in Wilts and 125 in Hants); East Grimstead, 125.

EAST GRIMSTEAD is a chapelry.

POST OFFICE - Charles Miller, receiver. Letters from Romsey arrive at ½ past 9 a.m.; dispatched at ¼ past 4 p.m. The nearest money order offices are at Salisbury & Romsey.

CARRIER TO SALISBURY- Pragnell, passes through Wednesdays & Saturdays.
