George Mills, of West Knoyle, a servant to Mr. R. C. R. Godwin, of the same place, farmer, was charged with leaving his masters employ. Defendant was a weekly servant and employed as a general labourer in husbandry at 10s. a week and lately he had been allowed to cut grass at 4s. per acre. On Tuesday, the 2nd inst., he left his work and did not afterwards return. He was fined 2s. 6d. and costs, or seven days' imprisonment.
