The Earl of Radnor, the Hon. and Rev. Frederick Pleydell Bouverie, George Matcham, George Fort, William Bird Brodie, George Lawrence, The Rev. Matthew Marsh and The Rev. Charles Grove.

At which meeting, the Earl of Radnor was elected Chairman, and George Matcham, Esq., Vice-Chairman; Mr. Cobb was elected Clerk; Messrs. Brodie and Co. were appointed Treasurers; and Mr. Daniel John Wright, of Downton, Mr. William Cooper, of West Grimstead, Mr. William Martin, of Bodenham, and Mr. James Blake, of Stratford-under-the Castle, were elected relieving officers for the several districts contained in the Union.

At the above meeting, Col. A'Court, the Assistant Poor Law Commissioner, attended, and explained to the Guardians and the several officers their respective duties.
