Whiteparish 1800-1849

1817

A few nights since a stavel barn, situate in a field at Winterslow, near the Hut, belonging to Mr. Robert Cooper, was broken open, and four bushels of wheat, the contents of a sack standing therein, were stolen therefrom. The sack was not taken away, but left empty on the floor. A granary standing near the barn was also broken open the same night, but as it contained only horse corn, nothing was stolen from it. We are sorry to add that the offenders at present remain undetected.

Committed To The New Prison, Devizes. Guy Penny, for three months, for maliciously destroying certain oak trees, the property of the Countess of Nelson, at Whiteparish. Wiltshire Independent, Thursday, 22 Feb 1838, Page 3, Col. 1&2

1839

Committed to Fisherton Gaol Charles Moody, charged with stealing barley, the property of John Tamlyn, at Whiteparish Devizes & Wiltshire Gazette, 28 February 1839

1847

Committed to Fisherton Gaol. John and George Every, of Whiteparish, one month each, for poaching. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 23 September 1847**
