

Post Office Directory Extract 1875

Whiteparish



Whiteparish (On the boarders of Hampshire) is in the Southern division of the county, Frustfield hundred, Alderbury union, Salisbury county court district, diocese and archdeaconry of Salisbury, and rural deanery of Amesbury, 3 miles south from the West Dean station, 91 from London, 7 south-east from Salisbury, on the road to Southampton. The church of All Saints consists of chancel, nave, aisles with a small wooden belfry, clock and 3 bells: in it are several monuments to the Eyre family: considerable improvements were made in the interior about 1853: a memorial window has also been placed in the east end to the memory of the late Robert Bristow, esq. The register dates from 1559. The living is a vicarage, yearly value £200, with residence in the patronage of Robert Bristow, esq., and held by the Rev. W. R. Tomlinson, M.A., of St. John's College, Cambridge, non-resident; the Rev. Joseph Henry Maclean is the curate in charge. Here is a National school and Endowed school for children of both sexes, also a place of worship for Wesleyans and Primitive Methodists. Charities to the amount of £6 10s. yearly are distributed in clothing. Broxmore House, the seat of Lieut.-Colonel C. Durie, is an elegant and spacious building, and the grounds and scenery around the house are beautiful and picturesque. Brickworth House, the property of the Dowager Countess Nelson, is now occupied by Captain H.A. Trollope, R.N. Coweshead House, the seat of W. F. Lawrence, esg., is at present occupied by Lieut.- Colonel Venner: it stands on the southern slope of the Dean Hill, and commands extensive views over a fine tract of country, including the New Forest and the Isle of Wight. The Dowager Countess Nelson is lady of the manor, and she and R. Bristow, esq., G. Fort, owners. The soil is chalk, sand and gravel; subsoil, chalk. The chief crops are wheat, barley and turnips. Whiteparish contains 6,284 acres of land, including the EARLDOMS, formerly extraparochial, but now a parish with 47 inhabitants; gross estimated rental £7,333; rateable value £6, 654; in 1871 the population was 1,148.

MELCHET PARK, the seat of Louisa Lady Ashburton, was formerly extra-parochial, but is now a parish, in Romsey union and Alderbury hundred, with an area of 830 acres, and a population in 1871 of 41. The House was burnt down in 1873; it is at present only partly rebuilt.

COWESFIELD, LOVERS, ALDERTON (or Alderston), WHELPLEY, AND COWESFIELDESTUARY are tithings.
