Of WEST HARNHAM WILTS, being desirous in order to carry out the wishes of his later sister MARY WING, and his mother ELIZABETH WING, created a Charity for the benefit of the people of Whiteparish, in the County of Wilts, to be known as "THE ROBERT and MARY GAMBLING TRUST". In memory of his grandparents Robert and Mary Gambling, formerly residents in the said parish by purchasing the sum of £1486.18.9 two pounds 10/- per centum Annuities, the net Income arising therefrom to be applied, two thirds for the purpose of supplying medical comforts and appliances and extra nourishment and nursing for the relief of poor people in time of sickness, the remaining one third, for the benefit of five poor men, and five poor women, living in the said parish of Whiteparish, and free from any distinction of Creed or Party, Further MARY WING, made a Rent-Charge of £2.10. 0 on the house now occupied and owned by MR. RICHARD DRAKE situated in the Sand Road Whiteparish, to be annually divided equally between five deserving women, residents of Whiteparish.
