KENNET AND AMESBURY TURNPIKE ROAD

NOTICE is *hereby given*, that a SPECIAL MEETING of the Trustees of this Turnpike will be holden at the ROSE and CROWN INN, *Woodborough*, on Friday the thirtieth day of July instant, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon, to ORDER and DIRECT that the two TOLL GATES recently erected on the Marden Branch of the said Turnpike-road at the end of Hatfield Lane, in the parish of Beechingstoke, be REMOVED: the one to the bottom of Yard's Lane, in the parish of Hilcot; the other to be placed across the road adjoining Yard's Lane, and leading from Hilcot, to Cuttenham; and also to order and direct that a Toll Gate be erected at or near the same spot, across the road leading from Perry's corner, to Hilcot; and that another Toll Gate be erected at Woodborough Cross Lane, in the parish of Woodborough, across the highway there, leading from Honey-street, to the Rose and Crown Inn, aforesaid; and that another Toll Gate or Side Bar be erected at the side of the said turnpike-road, on a spot near adjoining Woodborough Cross Lane, in the parish of Woodborough, across the highway there, leading to Stanton Mills, with proper Toll-houses and conveniences to the same respectively. Dated this fourteenth day of July, 1841.
