

Letter from the Vicarage



This appeared on a notice board in Coventry Cathedral in July 2015 and has been copied in churches across the world.

"We extend a special welcome to those who are single, married, divorced, widowed, gay, confused, filthy rich, comfortable, or dirt poor.

We extend a special welcome to wailing babies and excited toddlers. We welcome you whether you can sing like Pavarotti or just growl quietly to yourself. You're welcome here if you're 'just browsing', just woken up or just got out of prison, We don't care if you're more Christian than the Archbishop of Canterbury, or haven't been to church since Christmas 10 years ago.

We extend a special welcome to those who are over 60 but not grown up yet, and to teenagers who are growing up too fast. We welcome keep-fit mums, football dads, starving artists, tree-huggers, lattesippers, vegetarians, junk-food eaters. We welcome those who are in recovery or still addicted.

We welcome you if you're having problems, are down in the dumps or don't like "organised religion". (We're not that keen on it either!) We offer a welcome to those who think the earth is flat, work too hard, don't work, can't spell, or are here because granny is visiting and wanted to come to the Cathedral.

We welcome those who are inked, pierced, both or neither. We offer a special welcome to those who could use a prayer right now; had religion shoved down their throat as kids or got lost in the

city centre and wound up here by mistake. We welcome pilgrims, tourists, seekers, doubters ... and you!"

That seems to sum up nicely Jesus attitude to people. He sought out those who were excluded and neglected and simply made them feel accepted.

The Church has sometimes given the impression it's for certain people only. "Become like us and then we'll accept you". How different that is from Jesus. His ministry was all about finding people who somehow didn't fit and making them feel at home.

Of course, in our churches we sometimes get it wrong because we're human, but radical welcome and hospitality should be something that characterises our church communities.

If you haven't been to see us for a while drop in and meet us. If we can get within a mile of making you feel how Jesus made people feel it will be worth it. Who knows, you may find you enjoy the experience and come back for more!



A Message from Richard Gamble Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division

At this time of year, for many in the public sector, the mind is focussed on money.

Wiltshire Council, for example, will decide in February what level of council tax to set for the coming financial year that runs from April 2016 to March 2017. Although the figures are not yet determined, we know that the grant from government will again fall by a significant amount. Just like you, local government must balance its expenditure against its income so all departments across the council are yet again considering where savings can be made.

The task of deciding where to spend money is often not a matter of free choice. Many of the tasks undertaken by local government are laid down by statute and are thus obligations that cannot be avoided.

For example, any child that lives more than 3 miles from its designated school (2 miles for the under-eights) is entitled to free transport to that school. In a rural county like Wiltshire, that involves moving many thousands of children many miles every school day. The total cost over the year runs into several million pounds. It is a cost that cannot be avoided, although you may agree that it is spent in a good cause.

The council also spends several million pounds on supporting rural bus services. In this case, however, there is no obligation to do so. One such subsidised service is Wilts and Dorset service 2 between Devizes and Salisbury. In contrast, the X72 to Devizes and Bath is commercial and operates without subsidy. Wiltshire Council is consulting on where savings can be made and, if you are a bus user, I urge you to take part. Details can be found here http://www.wiltshire.gov.uk/news/articles/bus-service-consultation.

Wiltshire Council also spends money on traffic management. You would think that painting a yellow line to control parking or moving a speed limit sign to a better position would be cheap and simple tasks. Indeed, the cost of actually painting the line or moving the sign is negligible. But the bureaucratic procedure required to issue a Traffic Regulation Order costs several thousand pounds, so the council is generally very reluctant to undertake these otherwise simple tasks.

Such examples are not uncommon. Therefore, if local government is to find the money to support good causes like rural bus services, a reduction in the burden of unnecessary, bureaucratic regulations would be a great help.

I have 4 x % lamb freezer packs for sale. These lambs will be 9 months old and 100% grass fed on Worton pasture for their entire lives. Being a traditional breed they take longer to reach a good weight and this is reflected in the amazing flavour and texture of the meat.

Zwarbtle lambs produce lean, dark tasty meat. There is virtually no fat and yet the meat is still succulent and tasty. The Zwarbtie lamb is about 50% larger than a typical Spring Lamb and hence. the ½ lamb price is around £95 depending on weight. (£7.99/kg, Approx. £70 - £90 total).

Surely I can't be the only person who is bored by social media, and totally uninterested in what my friends had for breakfast, what they are shopping for, and all the other minutiae of everyday life. I am therefore trying to make friends outside of Facebook while applying the same principles.

Therefore, every day I walk down the street and tell passersby what I have eaten, how I feel at the moment, what I have done the night before, what I will do later, and with whom. I give them pictures of my family, my dog, and of me gardening, taking things apart in the garage, watering the lawn, standing in front of landmarks, driving around town, having lunch, and doing what anybody and everybody does every day.

What's happening on the farm!

So the bookies got it wrong!! No white Christmas! However as I write this the temperature is dropping below zero with the actual potential of snow, so we might actually see some of the white stuff this winter.

The past month has been busy here at Home Farm, before Christmas we had our annual herd bTB test. All the cattle passed the test and the test sheet was rubber stamped CLEAR. What a relief! It is always a worrying and stressful time when the annual test comes around, all of our fingers and toes are always crossed.

As calving happens all year round here at the farm, we are continuously having calves born however nine months before Christmas and new year our bull must have been busy over that two week period we had 22 heifers calve. Father is generally on calving duty at night, he plays the part of midwife very well!

The English partridge seems to be surviving well here at the farm, a small covey of six was spotted by the farm buildings just last week this is very encouraging as last year there were only four. This may only be a small increase however it's a step in the right direction.

Over the winter period we have a flock of 200 ewes which are all pregnant here on the farm grazing over the pastures. Over Christmas these sheep were subject to several dog attacks. One day we actually had a ewe killed by an unknown dog and the following day we had a ewe that had been chased into the brook, luckily our neighbours had seen what was going on and rescued the sheep that otherwise would have drowned. I must stress that all dogs are to be kept on leads and everyone to keep to the footpaths; it is no laughing matter when livestock is being harmed.

Garden BirdWatch monitors the changing fortunes of birds and other garden wildlife through its network of 'citizen scientists'. Observations collected by BTO Garden BirdWatchers are analysed by BTO researchers and published in leading journals. BTO Garden BirdWatchers have charted the decline of the House Sparrow, the rise of the Woodpigeon, and have discovered that urban birds get up later than their rural counterparts. They have also alerted conservationists to the impact of an emerging disease in Greenfinches.

We all love to see birds in our gardens and this promises to be a very interesting evening.


