Letter from the Vicarage

You may well know the Lord's Prayer by heart. We have been studying it during Lent because familiarity can obscure its depth and meaning.

Last week was 'forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us'. This is the only phrase of the Lord's Prayer Jesus comments on, because He knows how difficult and important it is. Jesus was quite clear; being forgiven by God must lead us to forgive others, no ifs, no buts.

Easter is about putting things right. Every human needs to be forgiven by God because we have ALL let Him down and fallen short of what He created us to be. The relationship which each of us should have with God has been broken by what the Bible calls sin. When Jesus died and rose again he made it possible for us to be right with God through faith in him. The relationship is restored, a new life begins. Forgiveness is offered to us as a free gift by God, but like all gifts it has to be accepted, and once we know the joy of being right with God we must begin the process of becoming more like Jesus, and that means forgiving others.

I meet some people whose lives are damaged by their inability to forgive. In fact, sometimes the damage passes down through generations until no one can remember the original hurt! If you want to see what unforgiveness can do, look no further than the news. The hatred between groups in places like Syria will only be healed by forgiveness. That's what happened in Northern Ireland; some people found the courage to say that, no matter what our grievances, we will forgive and move on.

If you ever say things like: "he still owes me an apology", or "it serves her right because of what she did to me", or "I've got a score to settle with them"; I suggest you need to forgive and move on. Unforgiveness makes us prisoners and eats away inside us like a worm in an apple. Do you sometimes wonder why an individual is crabby or bitter? I think much of it is to do with not being willing to forgive. Unforgiveness can even make us ill. Carl Jung, one of the founders of psychoanalysis, claimed that not forgiving contributes to many mental illnesses.

Don't worry if you can't forget, 'forgive and forget' is not a Biblical phrase, and while it is always the goal of forgiveness, sometimes it is never achievable.

And don't worry too much about feelings. Forgiveness begins with wanting the best for whoever hurt you even if you can't like them at this moment.

Jesus wants us to be free, and the only way to do that is to decide to forgive. Try praying for the person you find it hard to forgive, it is very difficult to lift them to God and still hate them. Do what Jesus says: forgive, and be free!

A Message from Richard Gamble Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division

The process of determining where new housing should go is not entirely straightforward. At a high level, the National Planning Policy Framework has set the principles in favour of more housing and the Wiltshire Core Strategy has laid down policies and minimum numbers for the county. In some cases, the Core Strategy specifies where new housing should go but in non-strategic locations like this Division, the picture needs colouring by other means.

The first driver for new developments can be developers themselves. Some of you will know that one developer proposed a very unwelcome housing estate outside Great Cheverell. Fortunately, they were seen off at appeal last year after much helpful input from the community. At a smaller scale, the Eastern Area Planning Committee has recently rejected a proposal in Market Lavington on the grounds that entry and exit to the site would be very dangerous, but this may yet face challenge at appeal.

A different problem has been encountered in Victoria Park where many residents would welcome some housing development if it would facilitate repair of the crumbling roads and footpaths and allow their adoption by Wiltshire Council. However, despite already having 50 houses, Victoria Park is designated in planning terms as "open countryside", which would normally prevent new development. I am trying to find a way around that problem.

More positively, Neighbourhood Planning teams in West Lavington, Market Lavington and Worton, are working to identify possible development sites and to assess community opinion about them. The required procedures are challenging to say the least, particularly for a small community reliant on volunteers with little or no professional experience. I commend their hard work (and some of you may know I should probably declare an interest here).

In all of these considerations, one common theme is the problem of highways and traffic. Our local road network is among the worst in the county. Let me know if you have a spare £15,000,000 or so, which could fulfil my ambition for a relief road on the Plain.
