

Death of Crimean Veteran - Captain Francis Pavy

Death of Captain Francis Pavy. A Crimean veteran.

The death took place on Friday afternoon at Markham, Wroughton, near Swindon, of captain Francis Pavy. The deceased officer, who was about 66 years of age, had been ill for some time.

Captain Francis Pavy, formerly of the 74th Highlanders, and late of the Royal Body Guard, of Foley House, Portland Place, Marylebone, London, died at Markham, Wroughton, Wilts., on the 21st ult., aged 66. He served in the Indian Mutiny Campaign of 1858, with the 74th Highlanders, and was present at the capture of Capaul [Cawpore] (medal).
