On the fourteenth day of June, one thousand six hundred and ninety, I Mary Munde, of Yatton Keynell, widow, being of good and perfect memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following. I will that my debts and funeral expenses be paid and discharged. All my goods and chattels whatsoever I give and bequeath unto my five children, namely William Munde, Mary wife of Symon Edney, Ann wife of John Edwards, Lydia wife of William Harris, and Dina wife of Richard Briggs to be equally divided amongst them at the discretion of my overseers hereinafter named. Nevertheless my will further is that for as much as my daughter, Mary hath already received the sum of ten pounds as part of a gift or legacy my will is that ten pounds or the value thereof shall be deducted out of her share or dividend and that the same shall be given equally amongst the other four of my children before named and to prevent contention my will further is that if any of my said children or their husbands shall declare themselves respectively not to be content or satisfied with

their legacy before given or shall sue or contend for a greater share then and on that condition I give such of them as shall so declare or contend the sum of five shillings only and such share or shares so refused I give to be equally divided amongst the rest of my said children. And I do hereby make and ordain my said son William, sole executor of this my will and I do appoint and desire my loving friends, Walter Edwards of Biddestone and Benjamin Power of Corsham overseers of the same and I give them the sum of one shilling apiece. I have set my hand and seal the day and year first above written. The mark of Mary Munde. Signed, sealed, published and declared in the presence of *William Maish, William Harris, Thomas Willshire.*
