1889 Supper

Annual Meeting

The annual meeting of the Bishopstone Brass Band was held in the band room on the 5th inst. Mr. C. J. Hibberd was voted to the chair, and the secretary submitted the annual accounts which showed that £16 12s. 1d. had been received during the year, and the payments were made as follows:- Paid to bandsman £9 4s. 6d.; new cornet £2 5s 0d.; repairs and sundries (including £1 12s. 6d. due to secretary last year) £5 0s. 2d. leaving a balance in hand of 2s. 5d. The accounts were passed without discussion.

The resignation of the Rev. H. Ault as president was received and accepted. For the committee Messrs. Hibberd, Hickman, Dore, and Stone were elected. Messrs. W. Cowles and E. Stone jun. were appointed to represent the bandsmen on the committee; Mr. R. Maisey was elected treasurer, and Mr. E. Wrigley secretary.

1894 Band Meeting

On Friday last the annual meeting of the Bishopstone Brass Band was held at the Royal Oak Inn. Mr. C. I. Hibbard being chairman. The balance sheet was read, and showed that the band is without debt. Mr. J. Wrigley resigned his office as bandmaster. The officers for the ensuing year were elected and Mr. R. Redford was appointed bandmaster.
