BREMHILL PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

A synopsis of Bremhill Parish Council's meeting on March 3rd 2014

Lyneham: Mr Tucker has had a meeting with the programme manager at the new Lyneham Technical College (on the old RAF base). The manager apologised for the lack of appropriate consultation with the Bremhill PC in the past and that he would address this in the future.

Neighbourhood Plan: Mr James reported that the Neighbourhood Plan continues to be developed and that a questionnaire on the future development of the Parish will be circulated.

Operational Flood Working Group: Mr Bailey reported on where significant flooding had occurred in the Parish. A working party has been set up under the leadership of Mr Tucker to investigate and try to mitigate the problems.

Mr Pearson is pursuing the repair of several potholes in the Parish as well as the number of blocked drains advised by Parishioners. The Parish Council expressed the urgent need to address these and a meeting will be held with Wiltshire Council to discuss next steps.

It is proposed that Bremhill is to enter the best kept village in Wiltshire competition. Look for details in future editions of this newsletter.

CORNUELLES RECIPE

"Cornuelles" are very specific and traditional to the Charente area of France. They take their name from the 3 "cornes" (horns) representing the Holy Trinity of the triangular shaped biscuit with a large hole in the middle.

The "cornuelles" were traditionally eaten for 1 month of the year: 15 days before and 15 days after Palm Sunday. The hole in the middle of the biscuit allowed room for a blessed twig of box sometimes planted in an apple with a ribbon around it (box is traditionally used on Palm Sunday in France, not palms). There are also more modern variations using puff pastry filled with Cognac flavoured "crème patissière" or whipped cream.

Ingredients (for 12-14 "cornuelles"):

- 500g plain flour
- 250g caster sugar
- 200g of butter (preferably lightly salted)
- 3 eggs + 1 egg yoke
- Baking powder
- Anise seeds (sugar coated if possible)
- Vanilla extract (or lemon juice)



Preparation:

- 1. Mix the butter, sugar and the 3 eggs
- 2. Add the flour and baking powder as well as the vanilla extract (or lemon juice)
- 3. Roll out the pastry to 3mm thick
- 4. Cut into triangular shapes with 18cm sides
- 5. Cut a hole in the middle (the size of a glass)
- 6. Brush the pastry with egg
- 7. Sprinkle anise seeds in the corners
- 8. Put in the oven for 5 min at 200°C then 10 min 150°C

Remember the Jubilee? Thousands of local groups across the country got together in a uniquely British display of community celebration. Our villages here were no exception. I joined the Tytherton event, expertly planned for the one dry day of the weekend. It saw a superb turn-out for everything from flowers in the church (even Calne Young Farmers contributed a display), to games on the green - no I didn't come away unscathed from the egg-throwing competition - and dancing, even impromptu singing.

Of course our community spirit here stretches beyond the individual villages. This newsletter is itself a perfect demonstration of what we can achieve together. This year we can all celebrate together in a midsummer party. Like my Jubilee experience, it will be in East Tytherton - the geographic centre of the parish - but reinforced with the Bremhill Marquee, and hopefully with strong attendance and participation from across the parish. There'll be two parts: an afternoon fete and an evening barn dance.

MENIN GATE VISIT

My wife, Jophy, and I were lucky enough to be included in the recent Grenadier Guards trip to Waterloo. This was a battlefield tour arranged to coincide with a fund raising cycle ride from Wellington Barracks in London to Waterloo in Belgium. We spent the first night in Ypres and this was an opportunity for us to lay a wreath at the Menin Gate in memory of the Bays¹ and King's Dragoon Guards who were killed in the Salient during World War I.

As you probably know, every evening since 1918 (except during the German occupation of 1939/45), the local Pompier (fire service) sound the Last Post and Reveille, honouring the 30,000 plus who fell but have no known grave. The band of the Grenadiers played and the Major General (London District) said the exultation. We then laid a wreath. This was a very special moment which neither of us will ever forget.

An added bonus was that during our tour of Waterloo, we met the Trust committee members at Hougemont farm. They were able to explain their plans and financial arrangements for the refurbishment of the buildings. They indicated that they had managed to raise over 2 million euros towards this work and that it was due to start that week.



BREMHILL TANK PICTURE

The picture of the tank published in the Jan edition has sparked a lot of conversation and interest. The people in the picture (and indeed the tank itself) have now been identified but we don't have all the details.

Mr Chubb is standing in the front garden of number 23, Bremhill. Mr Chubb died circa 1940. This house was later used to house Italian POWs working on the farm. The ladies in the foreground are Mrs Minty (white dress and black hat) and Miss Fry. They were sisters and also aunts of Leslie Fry. They lived at the Bake House (opposite) but moved to number 12 later.

Mrs Minty was the widow of one of the people named on the War Memorial in the church yard. Many of us who have been in the village for 20 years or so, will remember Leslie, who lived in the Bake House. He was the village baker and a skilled glass engraver. You will see an example of his work in the church porch.

The vehicle in the picture of a tank driving through Bremhill is a Vickers Mk II* Medium Tank used from the mid-1920s to mid-30s. It is a Mark II* as it has an armoured box at the rear of the turret used for a wireless. This addition was made in 1932. The tank was phased out of use by 1939.

There is some debate about the unit involved. The Tank Museum believes that it must be from the Royal Tank Corps as these were the only units operating the Vickers Medium. The tank in the picture appears to bear a Prince of Wales plume of feathers, which is a symbol long-used by the local Royal Wiltshire Yeomanry (i.e. a Territorial, not a Regular, unit). However, the Yeomanry were not equipped with anything other than horses or searchlights until Jan 1941, so it seems unlikely it is a RWY vehicle.

It is most likely to be from the Royal Hussars or 3rd Dragoon Guards while exercising on the Plain and from the late 30s. It could also be from the 1st Tank Brigade operating in Salisbury Plain from 1934 or the 2nd or 5th Tank Brigade based at Farnborough and Perham Down respectively. The picture looks as if it was taken in the mid to late 1930's.
