Small Norman church recast in Perpendicular style. Three bay aisled nave with south porch. Small west tower. Two bay chancel. Rubble with stone tile roof, nave roof lead. Late C15 3 light square headed foiled windows to clerestory and aisles, labels with shaped stops. Two stage unbuttressed west tower with pyramidal tiled roof and no west door; Somerset tracery. Gabled south porch circa 1500, possible earlier, with moulded square headed surround and a 4 centred arch, with traceried spandrels. South doorway C12 with billet hood-mould. Small north door (C19, facing Vicarage). Priest's door to chancel. Interior: 2 bay round arched arcade with circa 1170s scallop caps and responds to south (squat earlier looking piers). North arcade C13. Interesting Norman font: tub on stem, upper band of triangular headed arcading, then a band of saltire crosses, next a band of pre-Urnes-type interlace and a scroll pattern with an animal; band of cable work; lower band of compass scratched intersecting circles. Roof: moulded ties with braces from corbels and moulded king posts, panelled. Victorian box pews. 1637 pulpit and reading desk. Chancel: pointed circa 1200 chancel arch with stiff leaf type crocket nook shafts and chamfered arches. Two light and quatrefoil chancel windows have rere-arches (but not in sanctuary). Three light reticulated (probably C19 restoration) East window. Memorial to Elizabeth Kete (died 1630), bracketted columns flanking tablet and supporting entablature.

Small graveyard contains a number of C18 and C19 headstones and tomb chests. There is a good mid-C18 example in the north-west angle of the church with scroll brackets in rebates, panels with carved drapery and oval panels with angels in the corners.

Hinton Manor Church Row Little Hinton DCMS Ref: 27/4 Grade: II GV

C17 altered in mid C19 and in early C20. Two and a half storeys, 4 bays. Rubble in part. Mostly brick especially above ground floor, brick dressings to right hand part. Stone tile roof. Mid C19 diagonal shafts to brick chimneys. Two gabled dormers to left hand part. Three light casements with applied timberwork in gables. Two storey angled bay to left (early C20). Doric portico to left of centre. Three light casements to right hand part. More irregular to rear: 2½ storeys, lower part stone, rest brick. Three + one bays, left hand part with central 2½ storey gabled square bay, and a 1½ storey 2 bay brick and stone tile extension to right on sarsen stone footing.

Mid 19C stable wing to north with 2 gabled dormers and wide through coachway. Attached stables and outbuildings to east which include a small mid C19 thatched and weather-boarded barn.

Somerset Farmhouse Church Row Little Hinton DCMS Ref: 27/51 Grade: II GV

Late C18. Two storeys with gable lit attic. Rubble. Three windows, modern casements, timber lintels in first floor. Central modern gabled porch. Slate roof with gable end brick chimneys. Modern outbuildings to left. Village pump on east gable end. Included for group value.

Parish Church of St Mary Church Walk

Bishopstone First listed:26.01.55

Heavily restored 1868 and 1883 (see rainwater heads). Mostly perpendicular in style with vestiges of Norman and Decorated periods.

West tower, 3 bay aisled nave with stepped buttresses, lower 2 bay chancel with stepped diagonal buttresses. Built of random rubble and ashlar on moulded plinth. Lead roofs. Two and three light square headed windows with labels and foiled heads. Two light clerestory (possibly rebuilt 1883) to south. Quatrefoil parapet to aisles (of St Michael's Highworth). To north: aisle windows have set back chamfer surrounds; north porch entrance appears circa 1200 and probably reset. In the chancel a very ornate reset small Norman doorway with horizontal chevron ornament. East window of south aisle has early C14 reticulated tracery. Crenellated west tower with diagonal buttresses and 3 set offs above plinth level: angled stair turret to south-east. Gargoyles to cornice. Two light and trefoil belfry windows. Clock to south. West door 1883 with usual Tudor arch trimmings and large 3 light perpendicular style window over. Interior: 3 bay 4 centred arcade, (one bay shorter to north for porch), undulating section to shafts. Organ over steep 4 centred chancel arch. C14 head stop reset to east of north arcade. Three C12 (probably) masks formerly on an order round a doorway reset above south door. Late Norman font with tongued scallops forming bowl on dog-tooth fillet; clustered shafts form the stem. The lectern, pulpit, parclose screens to east of aisles and to tower are good examples of Gothic (C19) carving. Marble tablet to Edith and Chris Willoughby (died 1673) with broken segmental pediment in chancel. Fragments of mediaeval stained glass. In the churchyard a number of C18 and early C19 headstones and a few early C19 chest tombs.

Dingle Cottage Church Walk Bishopstone DCMS Ref: 28/36 Grade: II GV

C18 or older, extended in C19. One and a half storey thatched cottage. Hipped roof with one low brick ridge chimney and a 3-light dormer cut into thatch. Two 3-light casements with wooden lintels. Plank door with modern weatherhood left of centre. Further plank door to right. Brick porch to right hand gable end. Two brick buttresses to rear.

The Shop Eastbrook Street Bishopstone DCMS Ref: 28/43 Grade:II GV Amended:23.04.82

Probably mid-C19 thatched. Chalk rubble with brick quoins and dressings. Two dormers cut into thatch, glazing bar casements. Two windows on ground floor, one blocked, one a C20 square bay (used as shop window). Door to left.

Two ranges of windows, 2 and 3 light casements, timber lintels on ground floor. One brick chimney, cellar window to right. Single storey extension to right possibly formerly a waggon shed, opening now blocked, one window. Interior of right hand cottage has large fireplace with slightly cambered lintel and chamfered surrounds.

Five windows, 2 light casements on first floor, 3 original window openings on ground floor (one blind, others with altered glazing) and large modern 4 light casement with Concrete lintel. Ground floor windows and central door have segmental heads. Modern glazed door lacking former gabled hood. Catslide to rear.
