

Pastoral Letter

During World War II, four young soldiers, who had been serving on the front lines for some time, were sent to a small French village for a little R & R. When they arrived safely in the village, they suddenly realised that it was Christmas Eve. They began to discuss how they would like to spend Christmas. One of the soldiers said, "You know, as we were coming into town earlier today, I noticed an orphanage on the outskirts of the village. Why don't we go there in the morning and take some Christmas joy to those children?" The others liked the idea and the more they talked about it, the more excited they became. So they went out and bought all kinds of toys and sweets and clothing, food and books and games, and early the next morning, they showed up at the front door of the orphanage with wonderful Christmas presents for all the children.

The orphanage director was pleased and all the children were delighted as they opened their gifts. All the children that is, except for one little girl who stood quietly to one side. She was 5 or 6 years old and her face was very sad. One of the soldiers noticed that she wasn't joining in, and he asked the orphanage director about the little girl. "O, bless her heart," said the director, "We only got her

last week. Both of her parents were killed in a car crash: there was no one to take her in, so she was brought here."

The soldier went over to the little girl and gently said to her, "It's Christmas morning and we have wonderful Christmas presents here: toys, clothes, sweets, food, books, puzzles. Which would you like? What do you want most for Christmas?" And the little girl said, "I want somebody to hold me."

Maybe that's the best Christmas gift of all - someone to hold us. As somebody once put it, "Rich is not what you have. It's who you have beside you." Well, this sacred season comes along once each year to remind us that "Love Came Down at Christmas," that, even now, God is reaching out to us with open arms, and that He wants us to accept His love and to pass it on to others. May you know love and peace and joy this Christmas and may you, in turn, pass it on to someone in need.





Our meeting in November on the 30th will be a get together in the village hall to discuss next year's programme, so if you have any ideas/suggestions we would like to hear them.



Christ Church PCC Meeting

The Parochial Church Council of Christ Church met on Tuesday 15 November and discussed the following:

- 1. Thanks were expressed to all those who had been involved in organising (and in coming to!) the very enjoyable Quizzine evening in the Village Hall on Friday 9 September. It had also made a useful contribution to church funds.
- 2. It is hoped that work on repairing the church cupola will be started in the new year. We are still awaiting guidance from the Diocese regarding what planning permission, if any, will be required.
- 3. The Deanery Synod Representatives drew attention, in their report, to the likely substantial hike in the Parish's "Share" (of Diocesan expenditure) next year. This is due, almost entirely, to the drop in numbers of worshippers in other parishes across the Diocese (but not, thankfully, at Christ Church!)
- The Family of Churches committee remains in good hands, following David's departure, and arrangements for the annual Newcomers' Party in January are in hand.
- 5. Alison Pratt, who is the Benefice's Safeguarding Representative, gave a major presentation about the steps being taken across the whole Church of England to ensure the safeguarding of children and vulnerable adults. These will have significant implications for our parish too, and more details of these will be announced, in due course.
- 6. A recent presentation by representatives of Bath Youth for Christ had covered the excellent work being done by Steve Dewar and confirmed that a good response had been received to their appeal for more funds to ensure the continuation of this beyond 2017. The shortfall is currently about £10,000, but so many children from other parishes, as well as our own, benefit from this work, that it is hoped the remainder can be raised in time. Forms are in church for anybody who feels able to commit (even just a few pounds each month) to support this valuable work.
- 7. The timetable for recruiting a replacement for David has been finalised, and it is hoped to appoint a new incumbent by the spring.
- 8. Steps to establish the new Wellsprings Benefice (a union of our benefice with that based in Seend) are slowly moving forward, but may require further public consultation.
- 9. The annual charitable giving schedule for Christ Church was agreed, as was the Christmas Service schedule (see special insert in this magazine)
- 10. Finally, warm thanks were expressed to the Chandler family at Five Lanes Farm, for hosting again the very popular Harvest Festival service in September.

A Message from Richard Gamble

Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division

Plus ça change, plus c'est la même chose as the French might say. If you need a translation, it means "The more things change, the more they stay the same."

You may be forgiven if you suspect that I have been musing cynically about some of the remarkable events of 2016, such as Brexit and Trump.

In fact, my thoughts had been stimulated by consideration of a matter with a slightly lower public profile - music education. Not long ago, if the parent of a child in school wanted that child to learn a musical instrument, the school asked Wiltshire Council and the council provided a music teacher. The parent paid the school, the school paid the council and the council paid the teacher.

That may sound fine, but the cost of administration to Wiltshire Council was significant. Government did not contribute, the music service was not a statutory obligation and many music teachers were outside the loop. To save money, did we walk away? No! Music education is important. In fact, we found a new way to do things.

The new arrangement is that music teachers are now independent contractors who deal directly with the school and the parent. The Arts Council has provided finance to confirm the credentials of every teacher and to support disadvantaged children. After one year, there has been no discernible change in the number of children learning music. Indeed, more disadvantaged pupils are being supported in a more targeted way. Not least, the vetting process is such that more teachers are being approved, so those who were previously outside the council employment structure are now accountable. The cost to the public purse is down by tens of thousands of pounds. So it's not so much *la même chose* as *mieux* (better)!

Music and Christmas are inseparable. Carols in church; Pop on the radio; Musak in stores and lifts –all contribute to the seasonal atmosphere. Government figures show that the UK's creative Industries, including music, are growing at almost twice the rate of the wider UK economy - generating nearly £10 million per hour.

So sing along and have a very happy Christmas!

This month has been fairly busy, with lots of cattle sales to go to where we have bought and sold cattle. As I write this article father has just rung me to say he has bought a Fleur! This is a very famous cow family, where by the owner of this family has won The Royal Show, The South-West Show, The Bath and West Show to name a few and the offspring from this family have gone all over the world.

This winter we have decided to vaccinate all our heifers under the age of six months with a pneumonia vaccine. Pneumonia in calves can be an issue over the winter so we decided that prevention is better than cure. There are several types of pneumonia vaccines on the market and to determine which one is best suited to the heifers we blood tested a random selection of the groups. The results came back and we purchased the right one to vaccinate them with.

Over the past few months the Barn owl has been making an appearance, it has been spotted by several people around the village and we have seen it swooping down in the paddock below the farm. This is always nice to see, a sight which is becoming quite rare in our countryside.

I would like to take this opportunity to wish you all a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year, for those of you that are hoping for a white Christmas the odds are currently 7-1!
