

Letter from the Vicarage



I am looking forward to a concert on January 23rd. (I know you will be reading this after that date). Tommy Emmanuel is one of the world's greatest guitarists and he is in Salisbury! Look him up on YouTube. He has played with Stevie Wonder, Eric Clapton etc and is acknowledged as the master.

He is also a deeply committed Christian, and he speaks openly of his faith and the hard times he has faced. In the music business drugs and alcohol abuse are rife, and at one period Tommy was under such pressure he became addicted, just to get him through. He says quite openly that it was only the grace of God which sayed him from himself.

Many of you will know that GRACE is my favourite word, and I never get tired of talking about it. It is the one thing which makes the Christian Faith unique. Most of the components of Christianity can be found somewhere in other religions, but not grace. So, what is Grace?

The Oxford Dictionary definition begins: 'attractiveness, pleasing quality'; and grace is certainly that. Later it says: 'The unmerited favour of God' and this is the heart of what Christians believe about grace.

The notion of God's love coming to us free of charge, no strings attached, seems to go against every instinct of humanity. The Buddhist has an eight fold path, the Muslim has five pillars, the Jew has a covenant; all of them ways of winning God's approval. Only Christianity dares to make God's love unconditional.

Perhaps because Jesus knew how hard we find this idea, he spoke a lot about grace. He told stories about grace, people who received good things they did not deserve. And that, he said, is what God is like. None of us can ever win God's approval by what we do – His standards are way beyond anything we can achieve. All we can do is recognise our need, trust in Jesus and receive His forgiveness, and we will become children of God.

If I were a betting man, I'd wager that many of you have a notion in your mind that Christianity is about earning God's approval. That is perhaps the most common misunderstanding about faith that people have today.

So, didn't Jesus teach us that we should behave in a certain way? Yes he did, but not in order to win God's love. He loves us anyway, and we follow Jesus teaching out of gratitude, not in order to gain a reward.

That means that when we do go wrong, and all of us will at some time or other, God does not wait until we are back on track to love us. He is there all the time, holding out his love and forgiveness.

Now, a God who loves you and wants you to become His child and so experience the fullest life possible; that is Good News. Like all gifts, this one needs to be received, acted on and lived out.

Who wouldn't want that? If you want to change things this year, perhaps make a new start or put something right, this is the place to start. I promise you, you will never regret it.


Small bunches of flowers will be prepared beforehand for distribution in the service, and we warmly invite everybody to come along.



A Message from Richard Gamble

Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division

Money seems to feature rather highly as a subject for consideration at this time of year.

At one level you are (perhaps that should be "I am") coping with the costs of Christmas which, like most good causes, does not come cheap.

At another level, you may have just submitted your tax return and HMRC could be smiling at receipt of more of your hard-earned cash.

It can be tough for businesses too. If you are a retailer, this is when you have to pay the suppliers of stock you may or may not have sold in the pre- or post-Christmas rush.

Money features equally large in the mind of the public sector, although the chemistry is slightly different. Public sector budgets work strictly to an annual cycle that runs (to all intents and purposes) from April in one year to March in the next year. As a general rule, any allocated funds not spent by the end of March cannot be carried over to the following year, so some public institutions may be found to be fairly extravagant in this season. I am an admirer of Prudence but, sadly, she sometimes goes on holiday at this time of year.

Of course, Wiltshire Council cannot be accused of extravagance and has saved some £100m of expenditure in the past few years by judicious management and without significant loss of services. The miracle is that we have done this while keeping Council Tax unchanged for 5 years. This represents a saving over the period of £782 pounds for a Band D property. So when you look at your bank statement, please consider how much worse it could have been if Wiltshire Council had not tightened its own belt over the period.

More savings must be made in the year ahead and Wiltshire Council is now discussing the budget for 2015/16. We must tighten the belt by a further £30 million, which will be tough but not impossible.

The public sector is sometimes accused of being flabby and self-indulgent but there is no doubt in my mind that financial discipline has made Wiltshire Council more fit for purpose. I only wish my own personal regime had been as effective in improving my physique!

Spring Term

Spring Term commenced on the 5th January. WORTON PARISH COUNCIL (WPC)

Road Safety - Most of the road safety improvements are in place now that the area for the school bus near Sandleaze has been completed. However, we are still awaiting the extension of the 30 mph limit at the eastern end of the village. Whilst the Parish Council is pleased at these road safety improvements, it is continuing to explore ways to reduce speed within the boundary of the village and as part of this on-going effort we have requested another metrocount (the black wires across the road) which is already in place. As part of the process to improve road safety, please may we remind <u>all residents to record accidents</u>; take the registration number, note the time, date and weather conditions, take a photo if possible and then give this data to any member of WPC.

PEAS (Parish Emergency Assistance Scheme) for flooding - A number of parishioners attended the meeting to discuss this and the Parish Council will be developing its PEAS plan for submission to Wiltshire Council.

Rose and Crown Public House - Fifteen parishioners and Mr Keith Green, the Rose and Crown publican, attended the meeting because Enterprise Inns have put the property up for sale. Concern was expressed about the potential loss of this amenity to the village. Enterprise Inns are marketing the pub as a going concern and the Parish Council agreed to support the retention of this amenity for the village.

Worton Tree Regeneration - The loss of trees from within the village has been significant over recent years and the Parish Council have agreed an initiative with the aid of a grant to plant young trees for the future. If you could accommodate some free trees (including protector and stake) then please contact us.

Council Tax Precept - The grant received by the Parish Council from Wiltshire County Council is reducing and the costs of maintaining the parish are increasing. Therefore the Parish Council has raised the precept by 4.8% to £10,015.58 which will equate to a rise of 15p per month for a Band D house to £38.87 per year.

Welcome to your New Councillor - Mr Mark Fisher was unanimously voted on to the Parish Council which means that for the first time in quite a while we will have a 'full house'. The Parish Council thanked Mr Philip Salaman for his interest in the Councillor vacancy and accepted Mr Salaman's proposal to forge stronger links with Marston Parish Council.

Local Youth Network - Are you aged between **13** and **19**? If so then you are invited to come and tell the Local Youth Network representative what you want in your community. You do not have to stay for all of the meeting and <u>only you know what you want</u> – so come and let your views be known!
