# Letter from the Vicarage

We don't usually take a newspaper, but Ann and I were on holiday post Easter (Vicars are encouraged to take a few days off then) and I read that a new survey had revealed some startling facts. Britain is the  $6^{th}$  most irreligious country in the world, it appears. Only 30% questioned said they were religious, whilst 53% said they were not. Interestingly, though, only 13% said they were atheists. That leaves the majority of people claiming to be 'not religious', yet neither are they unbelievers.

Often when someone dies I hear that they were 'not religious', but that they had favourite hymns or Bible readings. Is that because people have no time for organised religion with all its trappings, but are still spiritual? I have sympathy with that. There are times I am not fond of my part of the Christian church – it sometimes does and says things which make me uncomfortable. But that does NOT shake my faith in Jesus and His message.

Militant atheists say that we do not need religion to live in a civilised society; as though 'good' is hard-wired into us. China is the least religious country in the world according to the survey (although they were not allowed to poll in North Korea). It is interesting then, that the Chinese authorities are allowing more religious freedom at the moment. What is the official reason? China is also one of the most corrupt countries in the world and the leaders want the moral example of Christians to infiltrate into the nonreligious people around them. I think those wanting a civilised, courteous, caring society without faith should think seriously about that.

We are what we are in Britain today because of our Christian heritage. It is like a reservoir which, over the centuries, has provided us with our moral direction. Until recently the reservoir was topped up regularly, but now it seems to me it is running dry. We are fortunate in still having the water to draw on, but what will happen if and when it is empty? Already many things are condoned in society which are not encouraging Christian teaching or values, to put it mildly. There is only one answer, and that is to begin to put something back in to the reservoir.

What would you have answered if you had been asked the question in the survey? Are you religious, or an atheist, or one of the majority not sure what to think? I would encourage you to think about the important things of life, and especially Jesus and His claims. Don't worry too much about the church that bears His name, it gets some things right and other things wrong.

Just ask if **Jesus** is someone you could follow. It is in answering that question I believe we find the most important answers of all.



Rogation Sunday May 10<sup>th</sup>



Rogation is the time when people traditionally 'beat the bounds'. It was the custom to walk the Parish boundary and pray God's blessing on crops and animals.

We may not be able to walk the whole parish boundary, but we are walking through all three villages for Rogation this year. Starting from Marston Chapel at 3 pm, the route will pass through Five Lanes Farm, where at 4 pm we shall have an act of worship followed by a tea.

After tea, those who wish to are invited to walk on to Potterne, where lifts will be provided for those needing to return to Worton or Marston. If you are not able to walk you can, of course, drive to the venues and catch up with the important bits as they take place. If you need a lift please let the Vicarage know on 723189.

If you are coming, please bring a contribution of food for tea to the chapel, where a car will transport it to the farm, or drop your contribution in to Five Lanes Farm on the way to Marston. Do join us if you are able.





### **Marston Parish Council report**

24th March 2015

Philip Salaman chaired the meeting attended by 20 parishioners and representatives from Good Energy.

Prior to the start of council business, a Q&A session was held to raise issues regarding the solar farm development.

There were concerns regarding traffic movement and resulting damage to the village green. An area of Long Street will be widened to improve the access route. Potential encroachment on the green will be monitored and Good Energy has assured us that any damage will be repaired on completion of the project. A sum of money has been lodged with Wiltshire Council to cover any shortfall of works but it was generally felt to be insufficient.

Matters discussed by MPC:

Work on fencing the village field is nearing completion.

- MPC will receive approximately £5000pa for 30 years once the solar farm is operative. In addition Good Energy is donating £10,000 towards the cost of upgrading broadband to the village. Fast speed broadband is expected to be available from March 2016.
- Having attended a CATG meeting, Mr Salaman reported that it was unlikely that Marston will become a 30mph area. We would ask that drivers slow down on entering the village especially as there will soon be heavy lorry movements.
- As part of our flooding precautions all drains and gulleys will be mapped and Wiltshire will ensure they are cleared.
- MPC will support Worton's Neighbourhood Plan and has agreed our contributions to the Village Hall fund (£2,000).

# Superfast Broadband in Worton

It's on the way by the Summer.. but not for everyone

There are two Superfast Broadband (SfB) developments taking place that affect Worton:

### 1. Commercial Programme.

This is being rolled out and fully funded by BT, Virgin etc, where they deem it a sound business investment. To date, this programme has covered about 2/3rd of Wiltshire. The Devizes exchange has already been upgraded and can offer its customers SfB connection. The extension to Worton from the exchange was not included in BT's upgrade plans.

#### 2. Great Western Broadband


**(GWB) Programme.** The GWB programme is managed by Wiltshire and South Gloucestershire Councils, as part of the Government-funded, national SfB initiative. It is being delivered, locally under contract by BT, to those addresses (such as in Worton) not included in the commercial programme. By 31 March 2016, GWB promises to provide access to broadband speeds of between 24-80 megabytes per second (mb/s) for 91% of homes and businesses in Wiltshire in its programme.

The GWB work to upgrade Cabinet 21 (next to the telephone box on Worton High Street) is almost complete. The high speed services should be available from May from the broadband service providers to those who wish to pay for it. Howev-

er, the Wiltshire Council Broadband Team confirmed in March that not all Worton addresses are serviced by Cabinet 21. Some are linked to Cabinet 3 in Potterne! Cabinet 3 is not part of the current GWB programme but remains the responsibility of BT plc to upgrade as part of its own commercial programme. BT has advised that they do not consider the Cabinet 3 upgrade to be commerically viable, at this time. Wiltshire Council is considering a second phase of the GWB programme from 2016 onwards but there is no quarantee that Cabinet 3 will be included.

As a first step in working towards a solution with BT plc, I need to find out which telephone lines in Worton are linked to Cabinet 3. BT plc will not provide me with a list. You can individually find out your host cabinet by entering your phone number at the **BT ADSL Checker** webpage. Search this via Google. If you are linked to <u>Cabinet 3</u>, please e-mail your name, address & phone number to me at martin.rose@btinternet.com.

# West Lavington Fete and Fun Family Dog Show





### A Message from Richard Gamble Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division

How is your memory? If, like me, you are getting on a bit, you may find that it's easier to remember some events from your early life than it is to remember things from just days ago. Those old memories may give you the idea that life was once nicer than it is now.

Somebody recently told me that they thought the world was better 40 years ago. Less traffic, better television, polite children, respectable politicians. However, I'm not entirely sure they were right about the 1970s. I remember the oil crisis, the three day week, strikes culminating in the Winter of Discontent, stagflation, IMF bailout, devaluation, the cold war, Carlos the Jackal, Bloody Sunday, punk rock, maxi-skirts. Architecture was at its worst and I'm not even sure the weather was better.

At least in those days I was at ease with the cutting edge of technology. I was among the first to buy a Sinclair computer and I soon mastered the electronic game of tennis that it offered. I even had a phonecard that worked in cashless telephone boxes.

Unfortunately, I have since succumbed to another feature of the ageing process, that it is now harder to keep up with technology and social trends. I'm old enough to think that mobile phones are phones, but mobile. In fact, they are super computers that can access almost anything on the internet, can send or receive emails or texts, can take photos or movies, can direct you like satnavs and can have applications (apps) that perform miracles. With the **My Wiltshire** app, for example, you can report things like potholes, dog mess, graffiti, litter and street lighting on the go using your smartphone. More details are here <u>http://</u> www.wiltshire.gov.uk/report.htm</u>. If you are young enough, give it a try!

Education is one of those areas where, to some, the old world was particularly sweet. However, I have recently had the opportunity to visit many of our schools and, without exception, I have been impressed with the teachers and the children that I have met. Over 85% of children in Wiltshire are now in schools rated by Ofsted as Good or Outstanding, which is well above the national average. All of the schools in this area come into one of those categories and the head teachers, the staff and the pupils all deserve credit for that achievement despite the fact that our funding from government per child is about the lowest in the country.

Of course, the world is not perfect and who can tell what lies ahead, but I hope one phrase used by my grandfather still holds true. When asked how things were going, he'd invariably reply "Onwards and upwards".

### Neighbourhood Plan Public Meeting - Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> April at 7.30 pm

Worton Parish Council held a public meeting to provide an opportunity for parishioners to discuss a range of matters relating to the future development of dwellings within the village. The meeting was very well attended and Worton Parish Council would like to thank all who attended and supported the meeting.

The Wiltshire Council Core Strategy uses a large range of criteria to classify villages and Worton is classed as a Large Village. The Parish Council did seek clarification of the designation and did consider an appeal. However, on consideration of the criteria used it was clear that the designation was not a marginal decision and that on balance there were merits to Worton being a large village. One of the merits being that as a Large Village the Wiltshire Core Strategy does not permit development outside the settlement boundary.

It was explained that the settlement boundary for Worton will be made clear when the first draft of the Wiltshire Housing Site Allocations DPD is issued for formal consultation during July to September 2015 and that it is expected to remain broadly as at present with the notable inclusion of the newly built Sandleaze Court.

The status of **Strategic Housing Land Availability Assessment (SHLAA)** sites was explained and discussed. SHLAA sites are parcels of land put forward by landowners to Wiltshire Council to be added to a register of *potential* housing sites. Development on a SHLAA site outside a settlement boundary is against the Wiltshire Core Strategy and will only be permitted by a Neighbourhood Plan or a Development Plan Document (DPD) both of which are lengthy consultative processes and in both cases the normal planning process of public consultation would still apply.

Worton Parish Council is constantly reviewing the merits of a Neighbourhood Plan and the next review is due in September followed by a Public Meeting in October.

#### Worton Parish Council Extraordinary Meeting – 30th March at 7.30 pm

An extraordinary meeting was convened to discuss matters that had arisen which needed a decision before the 7<sup>th</sup> May meeting.

**Solar Farm** - Two representatives of Good Energy attended the meeting to advise that work was to begin soon on the Solar Farm at Long Street Marston. Good Energy confirmed that Worton Parish would receive an annual payment of £2,450 for a period of 25 years. Good Energy confirmed that note had been taken of the current condition of the roads and verges along the route to be used for construction vehicles and that Good Energy was in discussion with Wiltshire Council to ensure that the roads and verges would be restored to be as good as or better than they were prior to construction.

**Village Hall** - Representatives of the Village Hall Committee explained that a pledge of additional funding was needed in order to progress the grant application to Viridor. The Council unanimously agreed to provide an additional £3,000 and recognised the dedication and commitment of all the village hall volunteers in their support of this much loved facility at the heart of the Marston and Worton communities. It was agreed that a more equitable joint funding arrangement should be sought with Marston for the future.

### Letters to the Editor

#### Dear Sir

I was one of some 50 residents of Worton who found out about the poorly advertised Parish Meeting last Tuesday run by the Parish Council before their monthly session. The purpose of the meeting was said to be to make a 'two-way conversation' and to share our views on housing development in the parish and neighbourhood planning.

In the event, the first half of the meeting was taken up by the Parish Council attempting to explain their views and actions to date, which left limited time for wider participation. Nearly all the comments that followed were in favour of a Neighbourhood Plan, which would give us a greater say on the scale and location of any housing developments in the village. However the Parish Council refused to take a vote or have a show of hands on this or any potential development on the basis that the 50 of us were not representative of the village and it would be misleading and a waste of time.

This left many of us puzzled, especially as the Parish Council, in their meeting, then took little notice of what had been said and decided to delay making any decision on a Neighbourhood Plan until September, which is likely to be too late for any current development plans.

As a concerned resident, I would like to know what the purpose of the meeting was if our views were not considered, and why the Parish Council appear to think that those who turned up were not representative of the village. Over 10% of the adult population were present and I understood that the Parish Council were elected by us to represent us so surely they should take more notice of what was said. Yours sincerely
