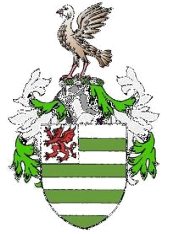




Post Office Directory Extract 1855

Barford St. Martin



Barford St. Martin is a township, parish and village in the Hundred of Cawden and Cadworth, Wilton Union, South Wilts, 5½ miles west-north-west of Salisbury, 2½ miles west from Wilton, and 100½ from London. The living is a rectory, value £577, in the gift of All Souls College, Oxford. The Hon. and Rev. Samuel Waldegrave, M.A., is the rector; and the Rev. Edmund Carr, M.A. is the curate. The church of St. Martin is a Gothic structure, and was repaired about 1850; it has a square tower and 5 bells. The population, in 1851 was 609. There are a Dissenting chapel and a National school. The parish extends over 2,243 acres, principally arable and pasture land. The Earl of Pembroke is lord of the manor.

GROVELEY WOOD is an extra-parochial place, with 30 inhabitants, 1½ miles north-west. In the neighbourhood are some ancient entrenchments.

POST OFFICE - John Turner, receiver. Letters arrive from Salisbury at ½ past 5 a.m.; dispatched 20 min. past 8 p.m. The nearest money order office is at Salisbury

CARRIER TO SALISBURY - William Lampard, three times a week.
