Private T. S. Snook is commemorated on a plaque at Barford St Martin, giving thanks for those who served and returned home.

The 1901 Census at Mount Lane, Barford St. Martin records:-
Tom S. Snook is 16 years old, born in Dinton, an ordinary agricultural labourer, living with his parents, James, 57, a railway plate layer, and Elizabeth, 54, and brothers and sisters, Alfred, 23, James, 18, Beatrice E., 14, Lyndale V., 11, and Percy Snook, 5, a grandson of his parents.

The 1911 Census at Barford St. Martin records:-
Tom Squire Snook is 25 and listed as son.

There is a marriage between Tom S. Snook and Ada L. Parsons in the December Quarter of 1912 and registered in the Wilton Registration District.
