Listed below is a short biography of those brave souls who gave their lives for their country and are in some way connected to Broad Chalke

BUCKLAND, WILLIAM - Lance Corporal 11371 - 1st Battalion Coldstream Guards - Died 13th January 1917 of wounds - Age 20 - Born in Bishopstone; Enlisted at Salisbury; Only son of Elizabeth S. and the late William Buckland of 191 Devizes Road, Salisbury - Buried at Broad Chalke Congregational Chapelyard, Broad Chalke - Grave/Memorial Reference - 2. 59.

COMPTON, GEORGE EDGAR - Private 7174 - 1st Battalion (Duke of Edinburgh's) Wiltshire Regiment - Died 28th August 1914 - Age 27 - Born in Bowerchalke; Enlisted in 1914 at Salisbury; Resident of Broad Chalke; Son of Edgar and Sarah Ann Compton of North Street, Broad Chalke - Commemorated on the La Ferte-Sous-Jouarre Memorial, Seine-et-Marne, France - Grave/Memorial Reference - None recorded

COMPTON, WALTER CHARLES - Private 201621 - 4th Battalion Wiltshire Regiment (Depot (T.F.)) - Died 19th March 1919 at home - Age 29 - Born in Alvediston; Enlisted at Trowbridge; Resident of Romsey, Hampshire; Husband of Ida Jenter (formerly Compton) of Michelmersh, Hampshire - Buried at Michelmersh (St. Mary) Churchyard, Michelmersh, Hampshire - Grave/Memorial Reference - None Recorded

CREIGHTON, FRANCIS ARTHUR (MM) - Private 42240 - 1st Battalion Worcestershire Regiment - Died 6th June 1918 - Born in Reading, Enlisted at Salisbury; Resident of Salisbury; Son of Frederick and Elizabeth Creighton, of West Howe, Kinson, Bournemouth; Brother of Sidney Raymond Creighton who also gave his life for his country - Commemorated on The Soissons Memorial, Aisne, France - Grave/Memorial Reference - None Recorded

CREIGHTON, SIDNEY RAYMOND - Private 103324 - 15th Battalion Sherwood Foresters (Nottinghamshire & Derbyshire Regiment) - Died 30th January 1919 of wounds - Aged 19 - Born in Swindon; Enlisted at Salisbury; Son of Fred and Elizabeth Creighton of Broad Chalke; Brother of Arthur Francis Creighton who also gave his life for his country - Buried at Terlincthun British Cemetery, Wimille, Pas de Calais, France - Grave/Memorial Reference - XIII. B. 21.

DOWSETT, WALTER DAVID - Gunner 126502 - T. 14th Battery, Royal Horse Artillery - Died 24th November 1918 - Age 20 - Buried at Solesmes British Cemetery, Nord, France - Grave/Memorial Reference - I. D. 12.

EMM, FREDERICK - Private 9044 - 1st Battalion Duke of Edinburgh's (Wiltshire Regiment) - Died 16th June 1915 - Born in Broad Chalke; Enlisted at Salisbury; Resident of Sydney - Commemorated on the Ypres (Menin Gate) Memorial, Ieper, West-Vlaanderen, Belgium - Grave/Memorial Reference - Panel 53

EMM, JOHN - Private 3/563 - 1st Battalion Duke of Edinburgh's (Wiltshire Regiment) - Died 12th March 1915 - Born in Broad Chalk; Enlisted at Salisbury; Resident of Broad Chalke - Commemorated on the Ypres (Menin Gate) Memorial, Ieper, West-Vlaanderen, Belgium - Grave/Memorial Reference - Panel 53

GURD, ALBERT - Private 6914 - C Company, 1st Battalion Duke of Edinburgh's (Wiltshire Regiment) - Died 23rd September 1914 of wounds - Age 29 - Born in Broad Chalk; Enlisted at Salisbury; Resident of Bishopstone; Brother of Mrs. Elsie Elliott of Flamstone Street, Bishopstone - Buried at Braine Communal Cemetery, Aisne, France - Grave/Memorial Reference - A. 12. (Special Memorial) - The precise spot in the burial ground of Albert's Burial is uncertain.

JONES, THOMAS CLIFFORD - Rifleman 4611 - 5th (City of London) Battalion (London Rifle Brigade) London Regiment - Died 13th October 1916 of wounds - Age 29 - born in Malmesbury; Enlisted at Hamsptead, Middlesex; Son of the Rev. John Owen and Mrs. Elizabeth Jones of The Manse, Bangor, North Wales; Employed as a solicitor firstly with the Public Trustee's Office and later in the British-American Tobacco Company's office - Buried at Grove Town Cemetery, Meaulte, Somme, France - Grave/Memorial Reference - I. L. 18

LOADER, FRANK - Private 290965 - 9th (Service) Battalion Devonshire Regiment - Died 26th October 1917 - Age 26 - Born in Bishopstone; Enlisted at Salisbury; Son of the late John and Eliza Loader; Husband of Elsie Jane Loader of Cliffside, Broad Chalke - Commemorated on the Tynecot Memorial, Zonnebeke, West-Vlaanderen, Belgium - Grave/Memorial Reference - Panel 38 to 40.

LOADER, FREDERICK WYNDHAM - Private 66560 - 10th Battalion Royal Fusiliers (City of London Regiment) - Died 16th May 1918 of wounds - Age 30 - Born in Bishopstone; Enlisted at Salisbury; Resident of West Winterslow; Son of Ellen and the late John Loader of Broad Chalke; Husband of Louisa Loader of West Winterslow - Buried at Mont Huon Military Cemetery, Le Treport, Seine-Maritime, France - Grave/Memorial Reference - VI. G. 4B

PENNY, WILLIAM - Private 33517 - 1st Battalion Duke of Edinburgh's (Wiltshire Regiment) - Died 24th March 1918 - age 27 - Born in Chase; Enlisted at Salisbury; Resident of Fovant; Son of William and Amelia Penny of West Farm Cottages, Fovant - Commemorated on the Arras Memorial, Pas de Calais, France - Grave/Memorial Reference - Bay 7

READ, ELGAR RALPH - Corporal 14940 - 9th Battalion Royal Dublin Fusiliers - Died 9th September 1916 - Born in Downton; Enlisted at Salisbury - Buried at Delville Wood Cemetery, Longueval, Somme, France - Grave/Memorial Reference - II. F. 7.

READ, HARRY THOMAS - Gunner 212563 - Royal Horse Artillery and C Battery, 108th Brigade Royal Field Artillery - Died 6th November 1917 - Enlisted at Salisbury; Resident of Broad Chalke - Buried at Ruisseau Farm Cemetery, Langemark-Poelkapelle, West Vlaanderen, Belgium - Grave/Memorial Reference - B. 11

STEVENS, HERBERT - Private 9645 - C Company, 1st Battalion Hampshire Regiment - Died 1st July 1916 - Age 25 - Born in Broad Chalke; Enlisted at Basingstoke; Resident of Salisbury; Son of Mr. and Mrs. W. Stevens of Broad Chalk - Commemorated on the Thiepval Memorial, Somme, France - Grave/Memorial Reference - Pier and Face 7C and 7B

TRYHORNE, FRANK - Private 22190 - 2nd Battalion Duke of Edinburgh's (Wiltshire Regiment) - Died 8th July 1916 of wounds - Age 32 - Born in St. Giles, Dorset; Enlisted at Salisbury; Resident of Salisbury; Son of the late William and Caroline Tryhorn; Husband of Annie Marie Johnson (formerly Tryhorn) of 542 Chisenbury Field Buildings, Enford - Buried at London Road Cemetery and Extension, Longueval, Somme, France - Grave/Memorial Reference - 6. B. 2.

WITT, FILMER - Private 447582 - 50th Battalion Canadian Infantry - Died 12th December 1916 - Born in Broad Chalke; Carpenter by trade; Emigrated to Canada in 1912 - Buried at St. Sever Cemetery Extension, Rouen, Seine-Maritime, France - Grave/Memorial Reference - O. III. P. 3.
