In the name of God Amen The fower and Twentieth of Maye in the yeare of our lorde god One Thouzande Six hundred and one I William Harkwoode of Calne in the Countie of wiltes yoman beinge sick in bodie but of good and perfect memorie I thanke god therefore doe make this my laste will and Testament in manner and forme following (That is to saie) firste I bequeathe my soule into the handes of almightie god my heavenlie father who hath made me and in Jesus Christe my onelie Saviour and Redemer and the holy ghoste who sanctified me And my bodie to be buried in the church yarde of Calne aforesaid where it shall please god to call me unto his mercie out of this Transitorye worlde Item I give and bequeath to the parish churche of Calne two shillinges And to the poore men & boy thre shillinges and foure pence I give and bequeathe to my daughter Suzan Harkwood two younge kine the one white ridged and the other hath a shorte Tayle of cullour browne red Item I give to my daughter Marie Harkwoode two blacke heyfers Item I give to my cozen Elizabeth Stockwell one lambe And to my cozen Anne Stockwell one lambe the rest of goodes nott bequeathed I give unto my wief

Joane Harkwood whom I doe make my whole and sole Executrix And I doe nominate and appointe to be my Overseers of trust William Bedforde and Walter Nicholas And to eache of them for their paines taken herein Tenne Shillinges a peece before *Philip Rich* vickor *John Bushippe* and *Richard ffowler*
