



Ivy Grace Pope (1896 - 1987)

She was born on 26 May 1896 at Honeystreet, Woodborough, one of eight children of George and Fanny (nee Drew). The birth was not registered by her mother until 2 July 1896.

The above photograph was taken 1901 - 1911 at End Cottage, Honeystreet, Honey Street Village. From L to R, Fanny, Doris?, Ivy?, Lionel? and George.

The 1901 census shows the family at Honeystreet, Honey Street Village, Woodborough.

Ivy was a Domestic Housemaid in the household of E. Montague Parbren, Clerk in Holy Orders, The Rectory Stanton St Bernard, Wiltshire at this time. Age recorded as 14 years.



This studio portrait was taken "2nd January 1917". The back of the postcard is the photographer "Jno Emberson, Wimbledon, Surbiton & Tooting".

The 1911 *Kelly's Directory* for Surrey refers to Emberson, John, Photographer, 18 Merton Road, which is in South Wimbledon, so must assume Ivy resided in the area during 1917.

Other postcards of Jno Emberson give the address 4 Imperial Parade, Wimbledon & 78 Victoria Rd., Surbiton & 248 High Rd., Tooting

Notice that her central hair parting, so good chance that Ivy is the taller girl in the photograph on page 1.



Annotated on the back of the photograph is "24 Jan 1925", taken by Burgess Bros. Photographers, Market Lavington.

Ivy was possibly a bridesmaid, maybe with her husband Alfred John Dearlove here, for the wedding of her sister Eveline Gladys Pope to Francis Charles Griffiths on 14 January 1925 (after Banns), in the presence of Sarah Doris Pope and Thomas Plumb.

The 1939 Register records that the Griffiths lived at Wantage. Eveline's date of birth recorded as 3 Nov 1893.

Ivy married Alfred John Dearlove in 3q 1921, Pewsey Registration District.

The 1931 Electoral Register shows they lived at Harnage Road, Brentford, Middx, whilst the 1937 and 1938 Electoral Registers recorded they resided in the High Street, Brentford.

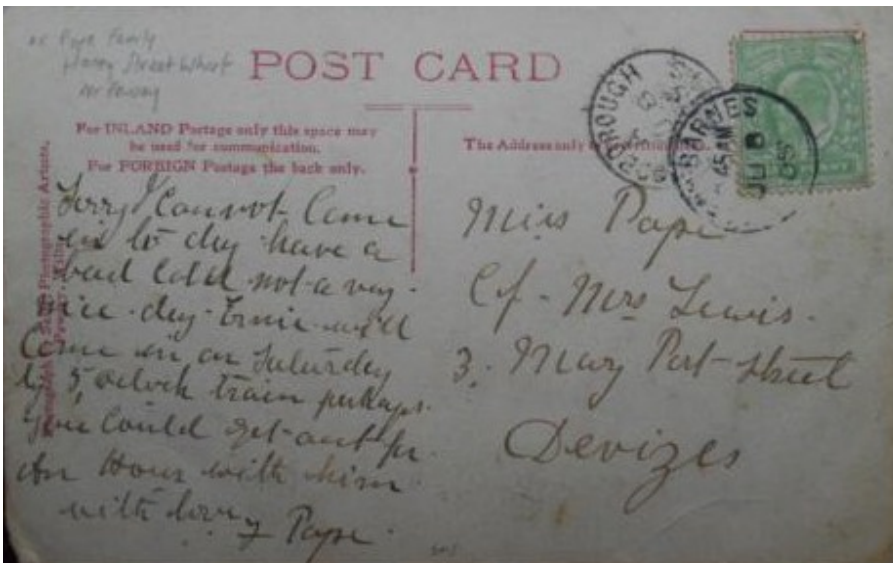
Alfred Dearlove was baptised at Putney, St. Mary on 7 February 1893 (parents Thomas & Sophia Ann, 10 Spencer Road, Putney); died at Brentford 20 Mar 1939 aged 46 years. Resided at 353 High Street, Brentford. Administration London 9 May to Ivy Grace Pope, widow and Lilian Alice Palethorpe (wife of Albert Glen Palethorpe). Effects £1497 14s 5d.

The 1939 Register (taken 29 September) recorded Ivy was living with the Sheppard Household, 36 Vicarage Road, Henley-on-Thames, Oxfordshire. Occupation "In Domestic Service" and a Widow.

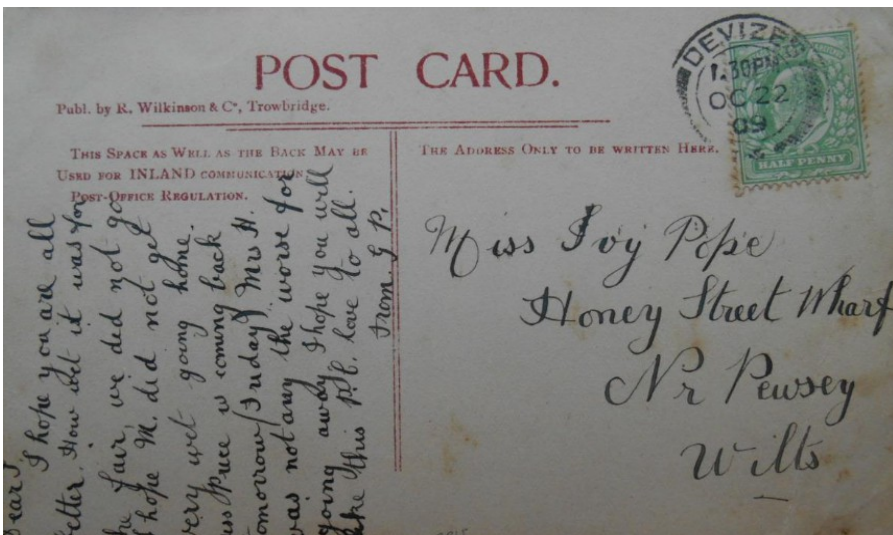
Ivy died in 1987 at Henley, Oxfordshire, Henley Registration District. I can find no trace of any Administration.

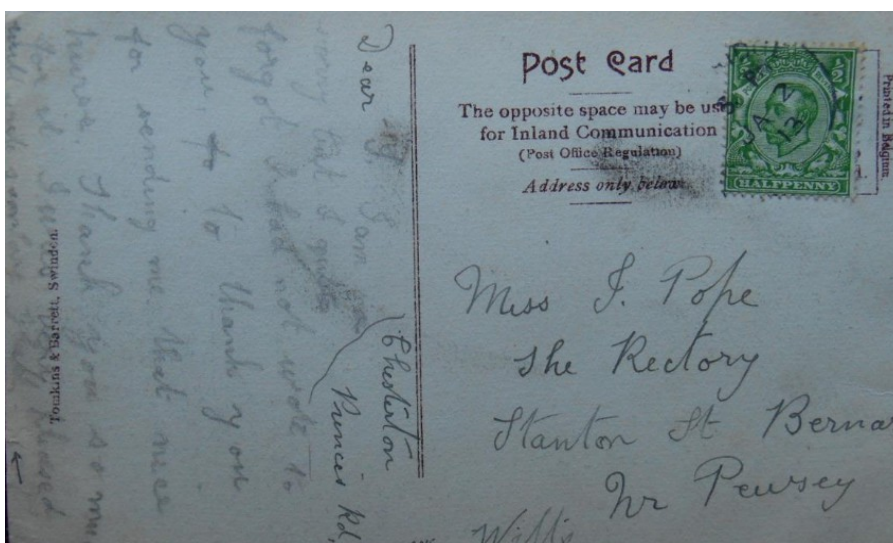
Ivy kept some of the postcards she received, I have listed 5 of interest.



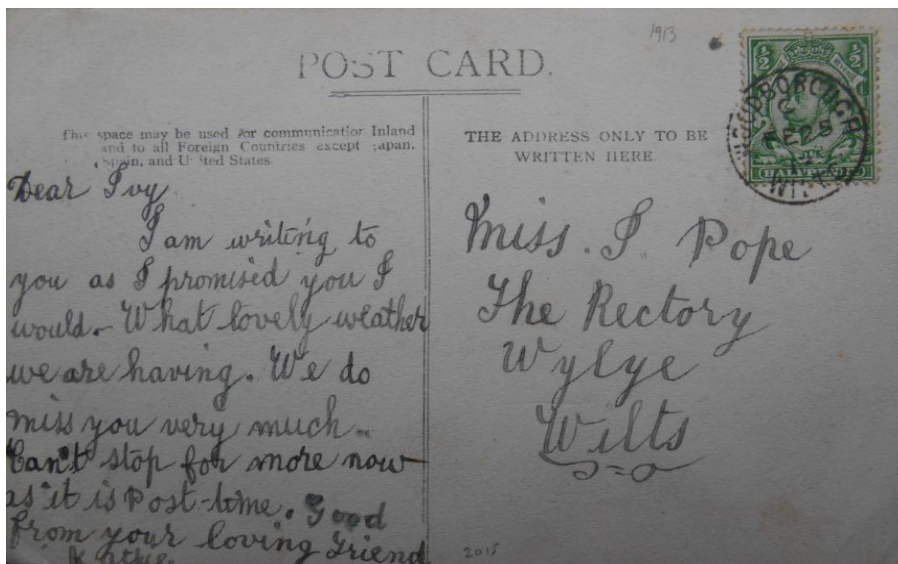
Dated 8 July 1905, from F. Pope to Miss Pope, c/o Mrs. Lewis, 3 Mary Port Street, Devizes.



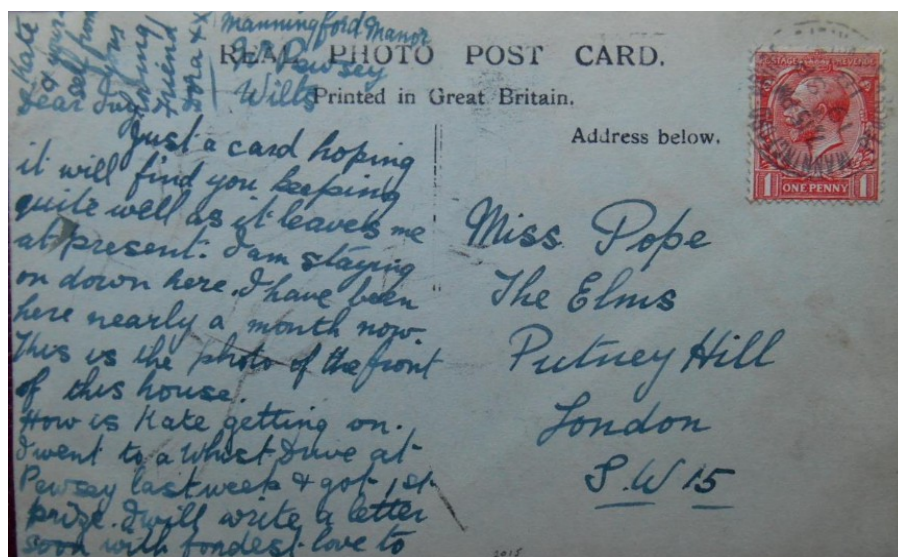
Dated 22 Oct 1909, from G. P. to Miss Ivy Pope, Honey Street Wharf, Nr Pewsey, Wilts

The Parents:

George Pope married Fanny Drew at Alton Barnes St. Mary on 30 Nov 1886 (after Banns), in the presence of T. Drew and Mary Ann Drew.

George was a resident of Alton Barnes and Fanny of Honey Street.

The parish record states that her father was George Drew (dec'd).

George Pope was born 1860 and baptised 23 Dec 1860 at Alton Barnes St. Mary. The burial took place at Alton Barnes on 9 Sep 1912. Residence Honey Street, Woodborough.

Fanny Pope was born 1861 and baptised 20 Oct 1861 at Devizes, died 1923 (Pewsey Registration District) . No burial recorded at Alton Barnes or Woodborough.

Honeystreet

A section of the Kennet and Avon Canal crossed the parish by 1807, with the whole canal completed in 1810. A wharf was built at Honey Street by 1811, the main cargo landed being coal which was carried by narrow boat from the Somerset coalfields. Honey Street became a hub for the various cargoes landed there, to be distributed to the hinterland. Passenger barges also plied the canal.

The Honeystreet settlement, now in Alton parish, expanded with the arrival of the canal, and the building of the wharf, and as commerce developed so the settlement grew.

After the arrival of the canal, barges were built at Honey Street and a steam driven saw mill operated on the wharf in the late 1850s. Wood, coal and slate were imported and were supplied from the wharf by Messrs. Robbins, Lane and Pinnegar. Chemical fertilizers were pioneered and manufactured at a site to the south of the canal by Ebenezer Lane who was the son-in-law of Mr. Robbins. As the use of the canal declined so did the industries in Honey Street. The saw mill, now powered by electricity remained on site and the buildings on the north were occupied by a rag processing company. The mill which was situated at the west of the parish was no longer in use in 1868.

The boundaries of Alton parish itself were finally moved to their current position at the beginning of the 20th century. In 1913 the rectory of Alton Barnes and the chapelry of Alton Priors were made one, bridging the gap between the lands at Alton Barnes and the old Shaw village site. Two further acts in 1928 detached the hamlet of Honeystreet from the ecclesial parish of Woodborough and affixed to Alton Barnes.

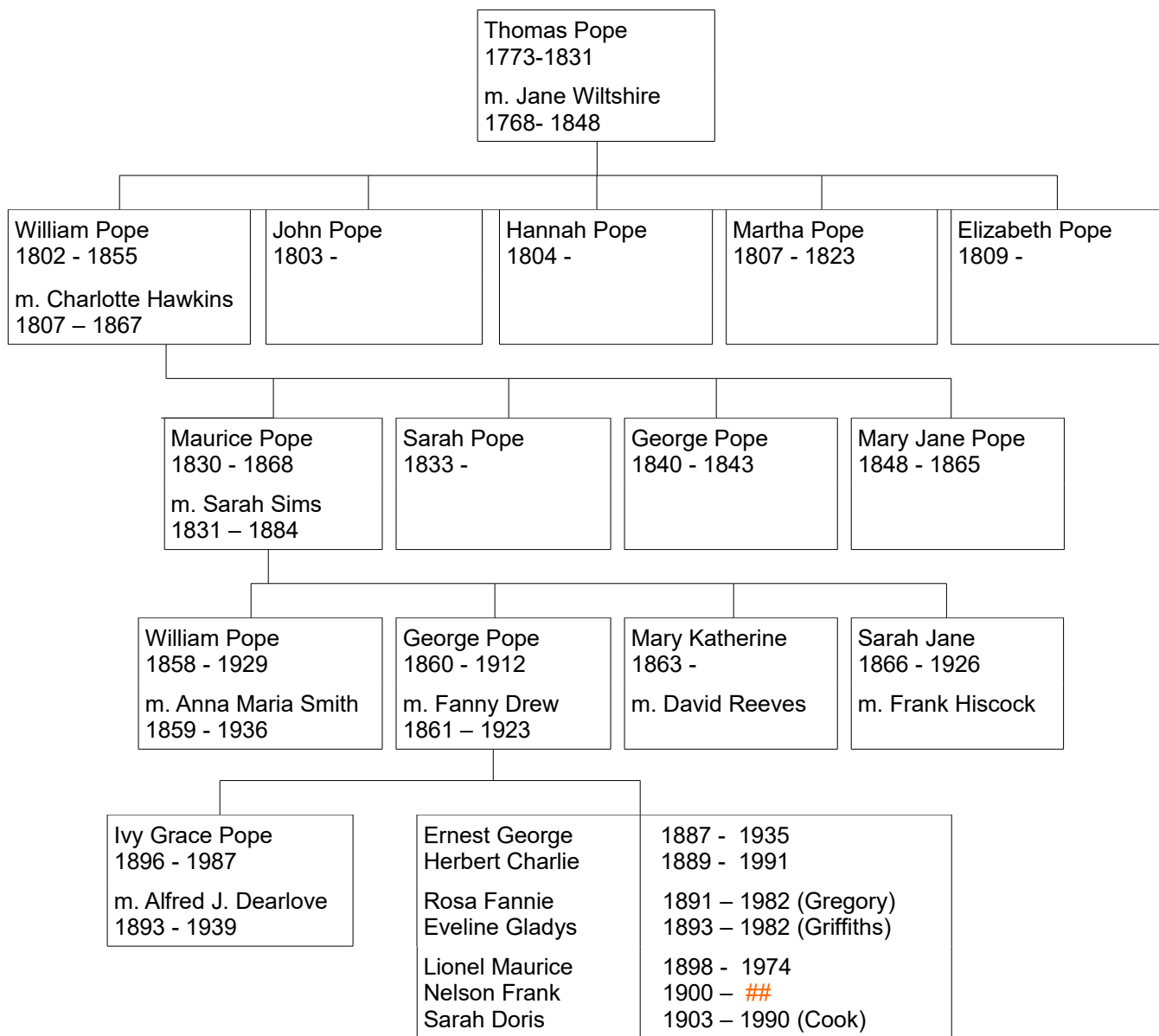
