

# **Kellys Directory Extract 1867** Wylye



Wily (or Wylye), is a parish and village, on the Wyley, or Wily, in the Southern division of the county, Branch Hundred, Wilton Union, Salisbury county court district, diocese and archdeaconry of Salisbury and rural deanery of Wyly, 11 miles west from Salisbury railway station, 8 north-west from Wilton, 6 south-east from Heytesbury, and 106 from London. The church of St. Mary was rebuilt in 1844, in the Norman style; it has a nave and chancel, and square tower with 4 bells, and contains an ancient carved pulpit and sounding board, which formerly belonged to the old church at Wilton, and were presented by Lord Herbert; the building is 90 feet long, 40 feet wide, including the aisle, and will seat about 250 persons. The register dates from 1581. The living is a rectory, yearly value £492, with residence and 10 acres of glebe land attached in the gift of the Earl of Pembroke, and held by the Rev. Joseph Samuel Stockwell, M.A., of Queen's College, Cambridge. There are some camps near here, one of which is Belbury. There is a National school in the village, supported by contributions; also a Dissenting chapel. The Earl of Pembroke is lord of the manor and the principal landowner. The soil is light loam; subsoil, chalk and flint. The chief crops are wheat, oats and barley. The area is 2,279 acres with a population in 1861 of 489.

**Deptford** is a tithing half a mile north, the property of the Duke of Somerset
