



Post Office Directory Extract, 1855

Wylie



Wily or Wylie, is a township, parish and village, on the Wyley, or Wily, 11 miles west of Salisbury, 8 north –west of Wilton, 6 south-east of Heytesbury, and 106 from London, in a Branch Hundred, Wilton Union, South Wilts. The living is a rectory, value £492, in the gift of the Earl of Pembroke, with 10 acres of glebe land attached. The church is dedicated to St Mary; it was rebuilt in 1844, and has a square tower with 4 bells; the Rev. Joseph S. Stockwell, M.A., performs all the duties. The population, in 1851, was 510, with an acreage of 2, 308. The Earl of Pembroke is lord of the manor. A National School is supported in the village, by contributions; also a Dissenting chapel. There are some camps near here, of which is Belbury.

Deptford is a tithing half a mile north.

Post Office. – James Davies, receiver, at Deptford. Letters received through Heytesbury & Salisbury at 20 min past 9 o'clock am. ; dispatched to Heytesbury at 4 pm & to Salisbury at 7 pm. The nearest money order office is at Heytesbury.

Coaches – Three daily from Salisbury, and three from Warminster.

Frome – James Smith, Monday and Friday; returning next days.
