

Will of Thomas Yerbury



1732

In the Name of God Amen I Thomas Yerbury of Bradford in the county of Wilts Clothier being Weak in Body but of sound and disposing mind memory and understanding Do make this my last Will and Testament in manner following that is to say Imprimis I give unto my Son Thomas Yerbury my Silver Tankerd and one Silver Spoon markt T Y : Item I give to my Daughter Rachael my Silver Saucepan Item I give to my said son Thomas my Silver Watch Item I give to my said Daughter Rachael Two hundred pounds to be paid at the Age of One and Twenty Years and also my Leasehold Tenement which I hold of Thomas Methuen Esq. During all my Estate therein But if my said Daughter should happen to die before she come to the age of one and Twenty Years then I Give the said Two hundred pounds and the said Leasehold Tenement To my said Son Thomas Item I give to my beloved Wife all the rest of my Household Goods and Plate Item all the rest and residue of my Estate of what nature or kind soever and wheresoever I give and bequeath to my said loving Wife Mary Yerbury and my loving Brother Richard Yerbury In Trust for the Proper use and benefit of my said Son Thomas But my Will is that the Interest and produce thereof be from time to time applied towards the maintenance and Education of my said Son till he shall come to the age of one and Twenty Years and then to pay the same to my said Son But if my said son shall happen to dye before he arrives to the said age Then my will is that my said wife and my said Brother do from time to time dispose of the Interest and produce of my said residuary Estate for the use and benefit of my Daughter as they shall think meet proper and convenient till she shall attain the age of one and Twenty Years and then to pay the Increase and Produce thereof which shall be then undisposed of and also the said residuary Estate unto my said Daughter Rachael And it is my Express Will and desire that my said Wife and Brother do from time to time receive the Rents and Profits of my said Leasehold Tenements and also place the said sume of Two hundred pounds out at Interest on the best Security that can be got for the same and by and out of the rents and profits of the said Tenements and the Interest that shall be ... of the said Two hundred pounds maintain and Educate my said Daughter Rachael till she shall arrive at the said the age of one and Twenty Years notwithstanding the disposition of the residue of my estate in manner hereinbefore mentioned And I do hereby constitute and appoint my said Wife and my said Brother Richard Yerbury Joynt Executors of this my Will In Trust and for the purposes above mentioned In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this Seventeenth day of October in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and thirty two _ Thomas Yerbury
