In the Name of God Amen I Lydia Parham of Wootton Bassett in the County of Wilts Widow being in good health of Body and of a sound and disposing mind memory and understanding praised be my good God for it do hereby revoke dissannull and make void all former wills by me heretofore made and do make and declare this my only last Will and Testament in manner and form following In the first place I give and bequeath unto my daughter Martha Parham the sum of ten pounds which I will shall be paid to her within two Months next after my Decease by my Executor hereinafter named I give devise and bequeath unto my son Edward Parham all my Messuages Lands Tenements and Hereditaments whatsoever and wheresoever the same lie Either in Possession or reversion To have and to hold the same unto my said son Edward Parham his Heirs and Assigns for ever And Lastly I give and bequeath unto my said son Edward Parham all my ready money and securitys for money Goods Chattels and Personal Estate of what nature or kind soever after the Payment of my just Debts and discharging my ffuneral Expences and of this my last Will and Testament I constitute and appoint my said son Edward Parham whole and Sole Executor and residuary Legatee In Witness whereof I have to this my last Will and Testament set my hand and Seal this twenty third day of September in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and thirty four _ Lydia Parham
