

Letter from the Vicarage



No matter what you think about it, there is no escape. The EU referendum is this month and we will have to make a decision. The arguments range over economics, security, trade, immigration and many other topics. Basically, though, I suppose the issue is one of power; where does it lie?

I meet people who seem to know better than those in Westminster or Brussels. They tell me: 'The answer is this' or 'What they should do is that.' OK, but I have a feeling that actually wielding power is much harder than pontificating about it when you don't have responsibility.

To have power is an awesome duty, but to have **no** power is devastating.

As I write this, in the Christian Church, next Sunday we think about power. It is called Pentecost or Whit Sunday. Jesus disciples were utterly powerless in the days following his death and resurrection. To begin with they were afraid and anxious, and as time went by, they were perplexed as the risen Jesus appeared to them over 40 days. He gave them a promise; they were to wait in the city until 'power came upon them'. This power, Jesus said, was none other than the Spirit of God, the very same power which enabled Jesus to fulfil his ministry.

On the day of Pentecost amazing things happened; the writer describing the scene can only say that 'a sound like a rushing wind filled the house and what seemed to be tongues of fire fell on those in the place.' But it is the effect on those people rather than the details of what happened, which is important.

A huge crowd gathered to see what the rumpus was about and Peter, one of Jesus closest friends explained what was happening. 3,000 people decided there and then to follow Jesus, and so the church was born. This was the first demonstration of what God's power working in ordinary people could do.

Jesus friends found they could do the things Jesus did; they healed the sick and spoke without fear before the authorities. Before long the state viewed Christians as a dangerous force and tried to stop their activities, but nothing could withstand this group, inspired and energised by the Holy Spirit.

Everything the first Christians achieved was without any political power and influence, they simply trusted in God and got on with it.

Back to the twenty first century. Jesus promises the same Holy Spirit power to us today. No matter how you vote on the 23rd, important though that is, of far more lasting worth is to live your life in the power of God's Holy Spirit. Where power lies in nations is important, but far more essential is to know God's power in your life. The Holy Spirit is the gift to all who follow Jesus, and you will never be offered anything more valuable.

Carers Week 6th-12th June

Caring is part of being human and at the heart of family life. As our population ages and people live longer, often with complex health conditions, more and more of us will find ourselves caring with 3 in 5 of us becoming carers at some point in our lives.

A carer is anyone who cares, unpaid, for a family member or friend who cannot manage without their support. They might look after someone with a physical disability, long term health condition, mental health issue or a problem with substance misuse.

Many people don't identify themselves as carers, they feel they are just doing what anyone else would so they don't always know what support is available to them.

Carer Support Wiltshire is a local charity supporting carers in Wiltshire. They help them to access support, services, education and training, and breaks from their caring role. As part of Carers Week (6th-12th June) they will be celebrating the contribution unpaid carers make to families and communities in Wiltshire with their Walk a Mile in My Shoes sponsored walk. Walkers are encouraged to decorate their trainers or swap shoes with a relative or friend and show their support for carers.

A Message from Richard Gamble Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division

Keep it in perspective, they tell me. Don't sweat the small stuff!

Actually, I think the small stuff is often important. There are many issues that bother people but some are more tractable than others (I can't recall ever using the word "tractable" in my Message before, but the Cambridge English Dictionary says it means "easily dealt with").

So if you are worried or annoyed about something, let's hope it's tractable. On the whole, clearing footpaths, mending potholes, collecting litter – all should be manageable if common sense and goodwill can prevail. It must be said, however, that regulations and bureaucracy sometimes get in the way of common sense and one of the hardest parts of my job is finding a way around such barriers.

Issues arising from human character can be more intractable. Dog poo in a public place is probably a reflection of the ignorance or arrogance of the owner rather than the dog, and that may require sociologists to find a solution. If you have unpleasant neighbours, you may need the involvement of the courts to arbitrate.

At a higher level, defining problems and finding solutions are inevitably more complex. Climate change, education policy, immigration, the NHS, the EU – we all know there are problems but it is naive to think the solutions are simple. (I can't ever recall using the word "naive" but it means "innocent, unsophisticated, artless, ingenuous, inexperienced, guileless, unworldly, childlike..").

What we see from the media on each of these topics often appears to be a war between zealots rather than an informed debate. Like you, probably, I have opinions about the issues but I don't pretend I am certain about the solutions. There are always questions to be asked. Are my ambitions for the outcome realistic or merely idealistic? Is short term pain worth long term gain? Can I rely upon the probity and efficiency of the institutions involved? More often than not, the answers are less than perfect.

If "certainty" implies "ignorance", I suspect the more zealous the commentator the more wrong they might be.

Your judgment is as good as mine on what is right but, on 23 June, we are no longer dealing with the small stuff.

Christ Church Annual Parochial Church Meeting

The Annual Parochial Church Meeting was held in Christ Church on Sunday 17 April, preceded by the Annual Meeting of Parishioners, at which both Mrs Heather Walker and Mrs Margaret Armand Smith were elected as churchwardens for the coming year.

The APCM was attended by 20 members of the Electoral Roll, and it was reported that the Roll remains at 63, the same as last year, after four names were removed and four more added.

The Financial Statement for the year to 31 December 2015 was presented and satisfaction expressed that, contrary to an earlier forecast, a small surplus was recorded, reflecting the success of the Stewardship campaign mounted in the Spring, together with the postponement of much of the anticipated repair expenditure. The latter will still have to be faced and will cause a significant drain of the church's resources, in the absence of specific further fund raising. The policy of the PCC is to maintain reserves at such a level as to be able to face the unexpected, as has been our salvation in recent years.

The Churchwardens, in their Fabric Report, explained the progress being made with the priority repairs. Decisions regarding these will have to be made by the new PCC. Copies of the report were made available to everyone and thanks expressed to the numerous people who help to keep the church and the churchyard looking so well - church cleaning, flower arranging, brass polishing and churchyard maintenance.

A report was received about the work done by the Deanery Synod, which had met three times during the year. Copies of the report were made available and also left in church. Louise gave a report on the work of the parish magazine team, and thanks were expressed to the editor and the many others who contribute in various ways. It is widely recognised that The Bridge provides a useful medium for keeping abreast of (and commenting on) village matters.

Three new members were elected to the PCC: Jean Lane, who has stood down as a churchwarden; Peter Witcher, the PCC secretary and Alison Pratt, secretary of the Family of Churches committee. The current sidesmen were re-elected enbloc and the comment made that more would always be welcome. Frank Marshall was felt to be willing to continue as the Independent Examiner of the church accounts and his reappointment was authorised on that basis. He was warmly thanked for his work on the recent Financial Statement.

The vicar discussed his personal comments, as included on the cover of the Annual Report. These featured the many achievements of his 12 year tenure of office. He also explained the likely changes to the Benefice when he retires in October. Details of these will be made more widely known, in due course. Both David and Ann were enthusiastically thanked for their tireless work and major contribution to the life of the villages over more than 12 years. They will be sorely missed.

There has been a scout group in Market Lavington since the 1920s. The group has its own hall and has many young members from the local villages as far away as Seend.

At the end of the year 2 leaders who have each been with the group for over 20 years are leaving. Full training is provided for all roles, along with support from the scout district and county. The training is recognised for membership of the Institute of Leadership and Management.

These are the roles that need to be filled:

Cub Leader (Akela) - The cubs meet 28 times a year. The leader wears uniform, plans and leads activities, and follows the full training scheme.

Cub Helper - Cub helpers help run the meetings about 7 times a year, running activities and acting as a witness to the events of the evening. There must always be at least 2 adults at every meeting.

Group Scout Leader - This is the person, who is the public face of the group. He or she will manage and support the Scout Group and its Leaders to ensure it runs effectively and that Scouting within the Group develops in accordance with the rules and policies of The Scout Association.

Training Advisor - The key role of a Training Adviser is to support a learner through The Scout Association's Adult Training Scheme.

In brief, volunteers in Wiltshire Link Schemes carried out a million miles in supportive journeys in 2015. Of that, Worton & Marston Link undertook 192 journeys which entailed 430 driver hours, these included 19 to the major hospitals. The other trips involved visits to various local surgeries, dentists and other essential trips.

We have 18 named drivers on the books, which may seem like a large number but with holidays, illness and other commitments, at any one time there is less than half that number available to be telephoned. Sometimes it can be difficult to fulfil our obligations so please come and join us, or ask your friends and neighbours if they have a small amount of time to spare. It only entails on average about an hour or so a month and petrol expenses @ 45p/mile are reimbursed. Please ring the Link number 720207 for further details.

The funds go towards our public liability insurance of £125, our telephone costs of £250, together with miscellaneous expenses of £30 and the petrol expenses.
