

# Letter from the Vicarage



Olympic time again and so far (day 5) several British athletes have not achieved what we hoped they might. A fall in the gymnastics, a crash in the cycling and years of hard work comes to nothing in terms of medals. It amazes me how personally many spectators seem to take these games.

Everyone becomes an expert, analysing what went wrong, as though the athletes owe them something individually. We have a tendency to think of people doing things on our behalf, sometimes quite wrongly. For example, a comment to me a few months ago shows how misunderstood is the role of a Vicar. "Your job, Vicar, is to do the religion for us all" I was told. Sorry, but I disagree with that.

With only a couple of months to retirement, and helping to put together a profile for the next Vicar here, I have been thinking a bit about my role recently.

The job of a Vicar is hard to describe, it is very varied and sometimes almost indefinable. It is difficult to measure success or failure; at the end of each day it is impossible to say 'I have made this' as a craftsman might. So what is my role about?

It is certainly NOT 'doing religion for other people'. The Christian Faith is not something that can be done for you. It has to be a personal relationship with God through faith in Jesus Christ and what He did for us, especially through the cross and resurrection. Like any re-

lationship there must be personal commitment. My job is to encourage people in that relationship, to help them grow in their own understanding of God and what He wants from and for each individual.

Going back to the Olympic picture; I am not the one who runs some kind of churchy race on behalf of the villages while everyone else looks on. I am more like the coach whose job is to encourage everyone to do what God wants of them to the best of their ability. In the Christian community that takes the form of deepening a faith already there, outside that community it is reminding people that God is there for them and wants them to follow His son, Jesus.

We are all in a spiritual Olympics of our own; my job, and that of my successor, is simply to help each person run their particular race. A thirteenth century prayer puts it perfectly: 'Dear Lord, of you three things I pray: to see you more clearly, love you more dearly, follow you more nearly, day by day.' Now that, it seems to me, is really what a Vicar is for!





### **WORTON PARISH COUNCIL (WPC)**

**Sandleaze Playing Field** - Sincere apologies for the disruption to the play facilities at Sandleaze created by the land drainage works. The land draining has left soil and stones in raised lines on the field which did not allow safe access. The soil level has since reduced and will be sown with grass. The field will be opened when safe. This work will ensure that the playing field will be much better over the winter and for years to come.

**Solar Fund Application -** The Worton and Marston Village Hall has applied for funds to the Community Solar Fund which is held by the Parish Council. Please take a look at the application below or on the Worton website, and let the Council know what you think. The Parish Council will consider the application at their September meeting.

#### SOLAR FARM FUNDING GRANT APPLICATION

The following applications have been received by Worton Parish Council for grant funding from the Solar farm monies:

Worton and Marston Village Hall Trustees - £1,500 towards the cost of refurbishing the village hall toilets. The overall cost of the work is estimated to be around £15,000 - £18,000 (all tenders not yet received) and will include reconnecting the heating system to the toilets and inner foyer; replacing the existing toilets with two new toilets that will be suitable for wheelchairs and have baby changing facilities; architect's and project manager's fees. Trustees would add this money to funds already raised through events that have taken place this year and to some from their reserves to provide the match funding required for further grant applications to be made to other organisations. The application is well supported by individual villagers and groups that use the Hall.

Monster Trail Organisers - £150 towards the Public Liability Insurance for the Monster Trail event in October. A one-day event open to the public featuring a self-guided 'trail' walk round the village to find the 'monster' scarecrows sited in residents' gardens. This event helps to bring the community together, enjoying and exploring the village on foot and contributes funds to organisations within the village.

If you would like to get involved with the plan, please contact the clerk.

Vacancy for a Councillor - There is a vacancy for a Parish Councillor which can now be filled by co-option. If you are interested in getting more involved with the life of the village, and can attend a meeting on the first Monday of the month (except August), then please contact the Clerk.

#### **Worton and Neighbourhood Plans**

In 2011, the Coalition government introduced the Localism Act, which was designed to encourage towns and villages to have more involvement and control over developments, infrastructure changes, the environment and the sustainability of their communities. They can develop their own Neighbourhood Plan, which, when signed off by their County Council, and agreed to by the majority of residents in a referendum, has legal standing and status. Hence, if a developer puts forward proposals incompatible with the Neighbourhood Plan, it will be rejected.

In Wiltshire, the County Council set about developing its own Core Strategy designed to meet future housing and other needs as defined by the Government. In the Devizes area, it identified six villages (including Worton) as Large Villages, and determined that these villages, along with Market Lavington, would provide 210 new houses to the Wiltshire plan by 2026. A number of potential sites, including the field to the side of Sandleaze and behind Sandleaze Court, were also identified.

Most of the other Large Villages, such as Potterne, Urchfont and West Lavington, decided to therefore to establish their own Neighbourhood Plans at this point. In Worton, the Parish Council objected unsuccessfully to the village being categorised as a Large Village, but decided to delay any decision on a Neighbourhood Plan because of the work and cost involved. However, in 2015, it did carry out a market research survey amongst residents, which an important element of any Neighbourhood Plan. This achieved a response rate of over 50%, and showed that residents would accept some limited development of the right type (affordable homes, properties suitable for downsizing) but would strongly oppose any larger-scale development.

When it became clear that all the other Large Villages were developing Neighbourhood Plans, and that there was evidence of their legal status holding up in appeals, the Parish Council reconsidered their position and agreed last November to proceed with a Neighbourhood Plan for Worton. With the assistance of a number of interested residents, they applied to Wiltshire County Council to develop a Neighbourhood Plan for Worton in January 2016, and this has now been formally authorised. The area covered is just the parish of Worton, which extends from Norney Bridge in the west to Five Lanes Farm in the east.

Following meetings organised by the Parish Council, a Steering Group to run the project has been established and has started work. The next two pages show a spreadsheet which the Steering Group have developed, which shows what we are trying to do and the key stages involved. It is expected that the work will take between a year and 18 months. The fourth page details who is involved in the Steering Group and how other residents can participate. As any Plan will have to be signed off by the majority of residents, it is critical that all views are taken into account and the Steering Group is representative of the village as a whole.

### **Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group**

The Worton Neighbourhood Plan will be run on behalf of the Parish Council by the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group, who will report back monthly to the Parish Council on progress. They will operate exactly the same as the Parish Council, so that if an item or development comes up that a member has a particular interest in, they will declare that interest and withdraw from the room while the discussion takes place. In addition, we have sought to make the Steering Group representative of the village as a whole so that it is not dominated by any particular interest group. It is essential that the views of the whole village are understood and taken into account

The Steering Group has three Parish Council representatives but is not run by the Parish Council. The three representatives are:

Suzanne Bonfield (High St)

Mark Fisher (Gaisford Chase)

David Johnson (Gaisford Chase)

There are then two members who have been elected Chair and Vice-Chair. They are:

# A Message from Richard Gamble Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division

One of the many good things about living in this area is the evidence of community spirit and good neighbourliness. We all get on with each other, don't we?

Most of us do, but I see a regular flow of issues that could be defined as un-neighbourly behaviour and they are some of the hardest matters to deal with.

Un-neighbourliness can take a number of forms. Littering is a common problem. It was staggering how much rubbish was collected from verges and hedgerows by the Clean for the Queen event. Don't drop it, take it home!

Dog poo is another perennial issue with deeply unpleasant results on pavements, footpaths, and grass areas. There are places where children cannot play and fields where farmers cannot allow their livestock to graze owing to the risk of infection from the faeces. Don't blame the dogs for the problem.

Shouting, loud music, smoke from bonfires, revving of engines – all are examples of crass behaviour that can peak in the summer, so I hope you have not been one of those to suffer this year. Overgrown hedges are another summer complaint. If vegetation from your land overhangs a public right of way or intrudes upon a neighbour's property, it's your duty to cut it back.

On the other hand, if one of your trees is a valued feature for the neighbours and the neighbourhood, please look after it. Trees take a lifetime to grow. If you own a good specimen, or if you own a forest, don't cut if you don't have to.

Inconsiderate parking that blocks driveways or prevents large vehicles from using roads and lanes is another common complaint. Just because a section of highway does not have formal restrictions does not mean it's OK to park. It's a criminal offence to obstruct a highway so think before you park. It could be a matter of life and death if an emergency vehicle is prevented from getting through.

Finally, if you are putting up a fence or building a shed, you may have a legal right but think of what it looks like from your neighbour's property. If they won't like it, try to find something more acceptable.

The message is "Do as you would be done by". It's an ancient principle. It's the Golden Rule.
